It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 27-18 of the General Laws entitled "Accident and Sickness Insurance

Policies" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

27-18-91. Epinephrine injectors.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

RELATING TO INSURANCE -- ACCIDENT AND SICKNESS INSURANCE POLICIES

This act would require group health plans and health insurance issuers that provide prescription benefits to cover at least one type of prescribed epinephrine auto-injectors and cartridges. No copayment or deductible would be required to obtain prescribed epinephrine injectors or cartridges.

This act would take effect upon passage.

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
