It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 42-28.2-8.3 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-28.2 entitled "Police
2 Officers — Commission on Standards and Training" is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 ~~42-28.2-8.3. Educational requirements — National certified mental health first aid~~
4 ~~training~~ **Educational requirements — National certified mental health training.**

5 (a) The commission on standards and training shall prepare and publish mandatory training
6 standards to provide instructions for police officers in ~~identifying~~ recognizing the possible
7 existence of a mental disorder and handling of complaints involving mental health/substance ~~abuse~~
8 use emergencies, and victims, witnesses, or suspects with mental illness or substance use disorders
9 and shall develop guidelines for law enforcement responses to incidents involving such persons.
10 The course of instruction shall comply with the certified National Council of Behavioral Health
11 Mental Health First Aid Program (MHFA) for law enforcement, or an International Certified Crisis
12 Intervention Team (ICCIT) training program, or other best practice training recognized by the
13 International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). Instruction and the guidelines shall include:

14 (1) ~~Identifying and recognizing~~ Recognizing the possible existence of a mental illness or
15 substance use disorders for the benefit of victims and witnesses, the availability of civil remedies
16 and community resources for persons experiencing mental health emergencies, and the protection
17 of persons with mental illness or substance use disorders and for law enforcement officers engaging
18 such persons;

1 (2) Providing information to law enforcement officers to recognize the signs and symptoms
2 of common mental illnesses and substance use disorders, de-escalating crisis situations safely, and
3 initiating timely referral to mental health and substance ~~abuse use~~ resources available in the
4 community.

5 (b) The commission shall include training in all curricula for recruits and in-service
6 trainees, in all police academies operating or certified by the commission. All law enforcement
7 trainees shall be certified by the National Council of Behavioral Health in Mental Health First Aid,
8 or an International Certified Crisis Intervention Team (ICCIT) training program, or other best
9 practice training recognized by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP).

10 (c) All law enforcement trainees shall participate in the course of basic training for law
11 enforcement officers, established in this section, as part of their required certification process.

12 (d) Training presenters shall include a behavioral health ~~practitioners~~ practitioner with
13 expertise in the delivery of direct services to individuals experiencing mental health or substance
14 ~~abuse use~~ emergencies, and may also include police officers who are certified trainers in the
15 respective training being delivered and victims, witnesses, and suspects with lived experience of
16 mental illness and consumer-survivors i.e. individuals with mental illness or substance use
17 disorders. Training presentations may utilize the staff of community-based mental health treatment
18 facilities.

19 (e) The course of instruction, the learning and performance objectives, the standards for
20 training, and the guidelines shall be developed by the Rhode Island municipal police training
21 ~~committee~~ commission in consultation with groups and individuals having an interest and expertise
22 in the field of mental health and community-based treatment.

23 (f) The Rhode Island municipal police training ~~committee~~ commission periodically shall
24 include within its in-service training curriculum a course of instruction on handling complaints
25 from or against persons with mental illness or substance use disorders, consistent with the
26 provisions of subsections (a)(1) and (a)(2).

27 (g) As used in this section, the following words and terms shall have the following
28 meanings:

29 (1) "Law enforcement officer" shall mean any officer of a municipal police department or
30 a department of the state.

31 (2) "Consumer-survivor" shall mean any individual ~~suffering from~~ with lived experience
32 of a mental health ~~disability condition~~ or substance ~~abuse use~~ disorder.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

1 This act would require police training on recognizing the possible existence of mental
2 health disorders and substance use disorders and would require certified crisis intervention team
3 training for all officers.

4 This act would take effect upon passage.

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
