RELATING TO BUSINESSES AND PROFESSIONS -- REAL ESTATE SALES DISCLOSURES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 5-20.8-5 of the General Laws in Chapter 5-20.8 entitled "Real Estate

 Sales Disclosures" is hereby amended to read as follows:

 5-20.8-5. Real estate disclosure form acknowledgement Inclusion in real estate
- 4 sales agreements Penalty for violation.
- 5 (a) Every agreement for the purchase and sale of residential real estate located in the state 6 shall contain an acknowledgement that a completed real estate disclosure form has been provided 7 to the buyer by the seller.
- 8 (b) A seller's failure Failure to provide the seller disclosure form to the buyer shall entitle
 9 the buyer to void the purchase and sales agreement by providing notice, in writing, to the seller
 10 prior to the transfer of the title at a closing does not void the agreement nor create any defect in
 11 title.
- 12 (c) Each violation of this statute by the seller or his or her agent is subject to a maximum

 13 civil penalty in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100) one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per

 14 occurrence.
- 15 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

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This act would allow a homebuyer to void a purchase and sales agreement prior to the transfer if the seller fails to provide a written sales disclosure. The act would also increase the maximum civil penalty for violating this law from one hundred dollars (\$100) to one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

This act would take effect upon passage.

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
