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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO INSURANCE -- ACCIDENT AND SICKNESS INSURANCE POLICIES

1 This act would require group health plans and health insurance issuers that provide 2 prescription benefits to cover at least one type of prescribed epinephrine auto-injectors and 3 cartridges. No copayment or deductible would be required to obtain prescribed epinephrine 4 injectors or cartridges.

This act would take effect upon passage.

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
