1	This act would require law enforcement to obtain consent or a warrant before placing audio
2	or video recorders on the private property of another. A violation of this act would make any
3	evidence inadmissible in any court proceedings. Additionally, this act would prohibit prosecutions
4	for violations of criminal laws in this state if the violation arises from the same set of facts or act
5	for which a defendant has been acquitted in federal court or another jurisdiction, unless there exists
6	newly discovered evidence substantially warranting prosecution in this state.
