11	At stake was nearly \$1,000,000 in available scholarship money, to be shared among the winning
12	teams; and

14	Armani Rios, Nikaya Garcia, Curiney Cain, Steven Sarabia, and Jakayla Steele, led by Chef
15	Instructor Mark Bennison, won the Culinary Arts portion of the competition; and
16	WHEREAS, A foodservice management team from the Warwick Area Career and
17	Technical Center including Tyler Lowe, Bruce Angelini, Kate Whalen, and Victoria "Harper"
18	Salinas, led by Instructor Austin Irons won the Foodservice Management portion of the
