It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 42-12-25 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-12 entitled "Department

2 of Human Services" is hereby amended to read as follows:

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42-12-25. Child care training, accreditation, technical assistance, and monitoring.

4 (a) The general assembly shall annually appropriate to the department of human services

5 such funds as it deems necessary to enable the department to assist providers in obtaining national

6 accreditation, to expand child care staff development and training, and for technical assistance and

- 7 monitoring, including but not limited to, activities which provide:
- 8 (i) Training opportunities for child care providers which foster a coordinated link between

9 the providers and the schools;

- 10 (ii) Specialized training for providers of infant/toddler and/or pre-adolescent care;
- 11 (iii) Evaluation of child care providers and programs through parent surveys and formal
- 12 evaluation techniques;
- (iv) Technical assistance and training for current and prospective non-English speakingproviders.
- 15 (b) The general assembly shall annually appropriate to the department of human services
- 16 <u>funding for the hiring of additional state child care licensing inspectors in order to meet the National</u>
- 17 Association for Regulatory Administration (NARA) recommended average of one inspector for
- 18 <u>every fifty (50) to sixty (60) child care providers.</u>

- 1 (b)(c) The director of the department of human services is further authorized to request
- 2 such appropriation for each state fiscal year as he or she deems necessary to carry out the programs
- 3 and purposes of this section.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
