It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 21-28.9 of the General Laws entitled "The Good Samaritan Overdose

Prevention Act of 2016" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

21-28.9-6. Opioid overdose prevention in college/university housing.

(a) Every college or university of higher education chartered in the State of Rhode Island shall provide training in the administration of opioid antagonists to every resident assistant as designated by the institution. Such colleges and universities shall provide and maintain onsite, in each college/university-owned or college/university-operated housing, opioid antagonists in quantities and types required by the department of health. Such opioid antagonists shall be accessible by every resident assistant for use during emergencies to any student, staff, or other individual on college/university-owned or college/university-operated housing premises suspected of having an opioid-involved overdose, even if there exists a previous history of opioid use.

(b) Each college or university described in subsection (a) of this section may designate additional employees who volunteer to administer opioid antagonists in the event a resident assistant is not physically present at a suspected overdose incident; provided that, such employee is trained in the administration of opioid antagonists by a program approved by the department of health.

17 (c) Any person or entity acting reasonably and in good faith in compliance with the provisions of this section shall not, as the result of acts or omissions in providing services pursuant

- 1 to this section, be subject to administrative liability, civil liability or criminal prosecution unless
- 2 the acts or omissions constitute willful and wanton misconduct, nor shall they be subject to liability,
- 3 penalty, or disciplinary action based on college/university rules, regulations, or procedures.
- 4 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO FOOD AND DRUGS -- THE GOOD SAMARITAN OVERDOSE PREVENTION ACT OF 2016

1	This act would mandate every college or university in Rhode Island to provide training in
2	the administration of opioid antagonists to every resident assistant as designated by the institution,
3	and would also authorize those colleges and universities to include trained employee volunteers to
4	act in accordance with this act. This act would also provide that the college or university and any
5	person authorized by the college or university to administer an opioid antagonist be exempt from
6	administrative liability, civil liability or criminal prosecution as a result of administering opioid
7	antagonists.
8	This act would take effect upon passage.
