RELATING TO INSURANCE -- ACCIDENT AND SICKNESS INSURANCE POLICIES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO INSURANCE -- ACCIDENT AND SICKNESS INSURANCE POLICIES

1 This act would require health insurance policies to cover licensed certified lactation 2 counselor services for childbearing families. It would also prohibit requiring supervision or 3 duplicate payments for services and mandates annual reporting.

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This act would take effect on January 1, 2026.

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
