SENATE RESOLUTION

REAFFIRMING THE FRIENDSHIP BETWEEN RHODE ISLAND AND TAIWAN, ENHANCING BILATERAL RELATIONS, CELEBRATING THE 40TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE TAIWAN RELATIONS ACT (TRA), AND SUPPORTING TAIWAN IN THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY

WHEREAS, The United States and the Republic of China (Taiwan) share a most 1 2 important relationship marked by a mutually beneficial partnership, supported by our common 3 values of freedom, democracy, rule of law, and a free market economy; and WHEREAS, President Tsai Ing-wen has worked tirelessly to uphold democratic 4 5 principles in Taiwan, ensure the prosperity of Taiwan's 23.5 million people, promote Taiwan's 6 international standing, further improve relations between the United States and Taiwan, and 7 maintain peace in the Asia Pacific region; and WHEREAS, Taiwan and the United States, and especially Rhode Island, share a 8 9 historically close relationship, marked by strong bilateral trade, educational and cultural 10 exchange, scientific and technological interests, and tourism; and 11 WHEREAS, In 2019, The United States and Taiwan celebrate the 40th Anniversary of 12 the Taiwan Relations Act - TRA (Pub. L. 96-8, 22 U.S.C. 3301) enacted on April 10, 1979 "to help maintain peace, security, and stability in the Western Pacific and to promote the foreign 13 14 policy of the United States by authorizing the continuation of commercial, cultural, and other relations between the people of the United States and the people of Taiwan, and for other 15 16 purposes"; and

WHEREAS, Since 1979, The Taiwan Relations Act has provided a strong foundation for

sustaining substantive relations between the United States and Taiwan, including Taiwan and

1	Knode Island, through continued exchanges, engagement, and cooperation rooted in the share
2	interests of freedom and democracy, thereby assuring a bright future in our bilateral relationship
3	and
4	WHEREAS, The United States ranks as Taiwan's 2nd largest trading partner, and Taiwan
5	is the 11th largest trading partner of the U.S. in 2017, with bilateral trade in goods and service
6	between the United States and Taiwan amounting to approximately \$62 billion in 2018 (Jan.
7	October), and said trade has created or supported approximately 322,728 U.S. jobs according to
8	the U.S. Department of Commerce; and
9	WHEREAS, New England exported more than \$1 billion in goods to Taiwan of which
10	Rhode Island exported \$38 million in goods, mostly in primary metal manufacturing, fabricated
11	metal products, chemicals, and machinery. Taiwan was Rhode Island's 6th largest export market
12	in Asia (2017); and
13	WHEREAS, Taiwan and the United States seek to increase trade and investment through
14	bilateral agreements, and discussions of possibly opening a joint trade office in Taipei, to includ
15	Rhode Island, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire and Vermont that will further enhance
16	bilateral trade opportunities and Rhode Island exports to Taiwan; and
17	WHEREAS, Taiwan has established reciprocal driver's license agreements with 31 state
18	across the United States, including Rhode Island which was signed on September 6, 2018. In fact
19	Taiwan was the first foreign government to enter into a reciprocal driver's license agreement with
20	Rhode Island, thereby granting mutual driving privileges in Taiwan and Rhode Island; and
21	WHEREAS, Taiwan is the 18th largest global market and its inclusion in international
22	organizations such as the World Health Organization (WHO), International Criminal Police
23	Organization (INTERPOL), and the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) are in the
24	best interests and safety of the international community. Taiwan is a key transport hub fo
25	international air travel and a large flight path in the Asia-Pacific remains under Taiwan'
26	jurisdiction. In addition, Taiwan's inclusion in the United Nations Framework Convention of
27	Climate Change (UNFCCC) is necessary in the global effort to combat climate change; now
28	therefore be it
29	RESOLVED, That this Senate of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantation
30	hereby celebrates the 40th Anniversary of the Taiwan Relations Act and supports Taiwan's
31	participation in international organizations and agreements, including the WHO, INTERPOL
32	UNFCCC and ICAO, and be it further
33	RESOLVED, That this Senate hereby seeks to further strengthen United States-Taiwar
2.1	and Taiwan Dhada Island trade and investment relations, and anapyrages the Dhada Island stat

- 1 government to further explore the possibility of opening a New England joint trade office in
- 2 Taipei to strengthen and promote bilateral trade between Taiwan and Rhode Island; and be it

- 5 transmit duly certified copies of this resolution to the Honorable Donald J. Trump, President of
- 6 the United States, the Rhode Island Delegation to the United States Congress, Governor Gina
- 7 Raimondo, State of Rhode Island, President Tsai Ing-wen, Republic of China (Taiwan), and
- 8 Douglas Y.T. Hsu, Director-General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Boston.
