It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 40-8 of the General Laws entitled "Medical Assistance" is hereby
 amended by adding thereto the following section:
- 3 **40-8-33.** Payment to non-emergency medical transportation service providers.
- 4 (a) To support the ability of non-emergency medical transportation service providers to
- 5 provide high quality non-emergency medical transportation services to patients, the executive
- 6 office of health and human services ("executive office") shall adopt and implement a
- 7 methodology for determining a Medicaid fee for services and reimbursement rate, for non-
- 8 emergency medical transportation service providers that is at least comparable to the rates paid
- 9 for similar services in neighboring states. These fees and rates shall apply to Medicaid eligible
 10 services.
- 11 (b) The rate determination methodology shall fairly recognize the reasonable costs of
- 12 providing these services. Recognized reasonable costs shall be those appropriate for the
- 13 organization, management, and direct provision of services.
- 14 (c) The executive office may require non-emergency medical transportation service
- 15 providers to provide assurances to the executive office that services are provided in an effective
- 16 <u>and efficient manner, consistent with industry standards.</u>

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

 implement a methodology for determining a Medicaid fee for services and reimbursement rate for
 non-emergency medical transportation service providers that is at least comparable to the rates
 paid for similar services in neighboring states.
