JOYOUSLY CELEBRATING AND COMMEMORATING PRIDE MONTH IN THE STATE OF RHODE ISLAND

1 WHEREAS, Annually, June is the month chosen to celebrate "Pride," a time for the 2 Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex and Asexual (LGBTQIA) communities and 3 all Americans to reflect on the struggles and injustices endured by LGBTQIA communities. It is a 4 month to take pride in the progress that has been made since the fateful Stonewall Riots in 1969, 5 in Greenwich Village, New York, which were in response to rampant discrimination by police and a legal system that was hostile to the LGBTQIA community; and 6 7 WHEREAS, LGBTQIA people still experience harassment and discrimination based on their sexual orientation and gender identity locally, nationally and internationally. At times, they 8 9 are still subject to being physically beaten and abused, and treated like outcasts or criminals; and 10 WHEREAS, Although much progress has been made, including, but not limited to, 11 gaining civil rights protections in Rhode Island in 1995 and 2001, winning the right to marry in 12 Rhode Island in 2013 and nationally in 2015, more progress needs to be made; and 13 WHEREAS, "Pride" is a time to celebrate the right to live authentically and to be proud 14 of "who you are" instead of ashamed by a social stigma that was, and unfortunately still is, a 15 reality in our society; and 16 WHEREAS, In order to form a more perfect union, America was founded on the principles of equality and "liberty and justice" for all, but for too long, since our nation's 17 18 founding, LGBTQIA Americans have been denied those precious rights and freedoms that were
