# AN ACT

#### RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY -- THE BREAST CANCER ACT

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows: 1 SECTION 1. Section 23-12.7-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 23-12.7 entitled "The 2 Breast Cancer Act" is hereby amended to read as follows: 3 23-12.7-3. Program established. 4 (a) Through funding from the Rhode Island Cancer Council, the Rhode Island department of health is required to establish a program of free mammography and digital breast 5 tomosynthesis (dbt) screening according to American Cancer Society standards, and, where 6 7 required, follow-up, diagnostic testing, and case management for women in the state who are uninsured or underinsured. 8 9 (b) The screening program shall: 10 (1) Secure radiology facilities to participate in the screening program; (2) Pay for screening mammograms and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings; 11 12 (3) Ensure that screening results are sent directly to the patient in a timely manner; 13 (4) Provide diagnostic tests as required to diagnose breast cancer; 14 (5) Provide case management facilitating appropriate contact to breast surgeons, medical

- (6) Provide follow-up support to women who are found to have breast cancer as a result of this screening program.
- 18 (c) The director of the Rhode Island department of health is required to provide a 19 quarterly report to the general assembly on the program of free mammography screening, follow

1 up diagnostic testing and case management, and public education. An advisory committee 2 concerned with advocacy, outreach, and public education shall meet on a quarterly basis and 3 report to the director. 4 SECTION 2. Section 23-12.9-2 of the General Laws in Chapter 23-12.9 entitled "Dense 5 Breast Notification and Education" is hereby amended to read as follows: 23-12.9-2. Public policy goals -- Department of health. 6 7 The department of health, through the Rhode Island Cancer Council, is authorized and 8 mandated to implement the following public health policy goals as they relate to dense breast 9 notification in Rhode Island. Commencing on October 1, 2014, all health care facilities that 10 perform mammography examinations and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings shall 11 include in the summary of the mammography report to be provided to a patient, information that 12 identifies the patient's individual Breast Tissue Classification based on the Breast Imaging 13 Reporting and Data System established by the American College of Radiology. If the facility 14 determines that a patient has heterogeneously or extremely dense breasts, the summary of the 15 mammography report shall also include the following notice: 16 "Your mammogram indicates that you have dense breast tissue. Dense breast tissue is 17 relatively common and is found in about forty percent (40%) of women. The presence of dense 18 tissue can make it more difficult to detect cancers in the breast by mammography because it can 19 hide small abnormalities and may be associated with an increased risk. Hence, you may benefit 20 from supplementary screening tests, which may include a breast ultrasound screening, or a breast 21 MRI examination, or both, depending on your individual risk factors. 22 We are providing this information to raise your awareness of this important factor and to encourage you to discuss your dense breast tissue, as well as other breast cancer risk factors, with 23 24 your health care provider. Together, you can decide which screening options are right for you. 25 A report of your results was sent to your physician. You should contact your physician if 26 you have any questions or concerns about this report." 27 SECTION 3. Section 23-17-32 of the General Laws in Chapter 23-17 entitled "Licensing 28 of Health-Care Facilities" is hereby amended to read as follows: 29 23-17-32. Mammograms -- Quality assurance standards Mammograms and digital 30 breast tomosynthesis (dbt) -- Quality assurance standards. 31 Any licensed health care facility performing a mammogram shall meet state-approved

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quality assurance standards for taking and processing mammograms and digital breast

tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings. The director of health shall have the authority to promulgate rules

and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

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1	SECTION 4. Section 27-18-41 of the General Laws in Chapter 27-18 entitled "Accident
2	and Sickness Insurance Policies" is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	27-18-41. Mammograms and pap smears Coverage mandated Mammograms,
4	digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) and pap smears Coverage mandated.
5	(a)(1) Every individual or group hospital or medical expense insurance policy or
6	individual or group hospital or medical services plan contract delivered, issued for delivery, or
7	renewed in this state shall provide coverage for mammograms, and digital breast tomosynthesis
8	(dbt) screenings, and pap smears, in accordance with guidelines established by the American
9	Cancer Society.
10	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, every individual or group hospital or
11	medical insurance policy or individual or group hospital or medical services plan contract
12	delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed in this state shall pay for two (2) screening
13	mammograms per year when recommended by a physician for women who have been treated for
14	breast cancer within the last five (5) years or are at high risk of developing breast cancer due to
15	genetic predisposition (BRCA gene mutation or multiple first degree relatives) or high risk lesion
16	on prior biopsy (lobular carcinoma in situ) or atypical ductal hyperplasia.
17	(b) This section shall not apply to insurance coverage providing benefits for: (1) hospital
18	confinement indemnity; (2) disability income; (3) accident only; (4) long term care; (5) Medicare
19	supplement; (6) limited benefit health; (7) specified disease indemnity; (8) sickness or bodily
20	injury or death by accident or both; and (9) other limited benefit policies.
21	SECTION 5. Section 27-19-20 of the General Laws in Chapter 27-19 entitled "Nonprofit
22	Hospital Service Corporations" is hereby amended to read as follows:
23	27-19-20. Mammograms and pap smears Coverage mandated Mammograms,
24	digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) and pap smears Coverage mandated.
25	(a) Subscribers to any nonprofit hospital service plan shall be afforded coverage under
26	the plan for mammograms, and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings, and pap smears, in
27	accordance with guidelines established by the American Cancer Society.
28	(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, subscribers to any nonprofit hospital
29	service plan shall be afforded coverage for two (2) screening mammograms per year when
30	recommended by a physician for women who have been treated for breast cancer within the last
31	five (5) years or who are at high risk of developing breast cancer due to genetic predisposition
32	(BRCA gene mutation or multiple first degree relatives) or high risk lesion on prior biopsy
33	(lobular carcinoma in situ) or atypical ductal hyperplasia.
34	SECTION 6. Section 27-20-17 of the General Laws in Chapter 27-20 entitled "Nonprofit

1	Medical Service Corporations" is hereby amended to read as follows:
2	27-20-17. Mammograms and pap smears Coverage mandated Mammograms,
3	digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) and pap smears Coverage mandated.
4	(a) Subscribers to any nonprofit medical service plan shall be afforded coverage under
5	the plan for mammograms, and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings, and pap smears, in
6	accordance with guidelines established by the American Cancer Society.
7	(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, subscribers to any nonprofit medical
8	service plan shall be afforded coverage for two (2) paid screening mammograms per year when
9	recommended by a physician for women who have been treated for breast cancer within the last
10	five (5) years or who are at high risk of developing breast cancer due to genetic predisposition
11	(BRCA gene mutation or multiple first degree relatives) or high risk lesion on prior biopsy
12	(lobular carcinoma in situ) or atypical ductal hyperplasia.
13	SECTION 7. Section 27-41-30 of the General Laws in Chapter 27-41 entitled "Health
14	Maintenance Organizations" is hereby amended to read as follows:
15	27-41-30. Mammograms and pap smears Coverage mandated Mammograms,
16	digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) and pap smears Coverage mandated.
17	(a) Subscribers to any health maintenance organization plan shall be afforded coverage
18	under that plan for mammograms, and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings, and pap
19	smears, in accordance with guidelines established by the American Cancer Society.
20	(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, subscribers to any health maintenance
21	organization plan shall be afforded coverage for two (2) paid screening mammograms per year
22	when recommended by a physician for women who have been treated for breast cancer within the
23	last five (5) years or who are at high risk of developing breast cancer due to genetic
24	predisposition (BRCA gene mutation or multiple first degree relatives) or high risk lesion on prior
25	biopsy (lobular carcinoma in situ) or atypical ductal hyperplasia.
26	SECTION 8. Section 42-62-26 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-62 entitled
27	"Catastrophic Health Insurance Plan Act" is hereby amended to read as follows:
28	42-62-26. Mammograms and pap smears Coverage mandated Mammograms,
29	digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) and pap smears Coverage mandated.
30	Any insurer, as defined in this chapter, shall afford health insurance coverage for
31	mammograms, and digital breast tomosynthesis (dbt) screenings, and Pap smears, in accordance
32	with guidelines established by the American Cancer Society.

1	SECTION 9. This act shall take effect upon passage.
