SENATE RESOLUTION

PROCLAIMING APRIL OF 2023, TO BE "PARKINSON'S AWARENESS MONTH" IN THE  
STATE OF RHODE ISLAND

1           WHEREAS, Parkinson's Disease is a chronic, progressive neurological disease and is the  
2 second most common neurodegenerative disease in the United States, second only to Alzheimer's  
3 disease; and

4           WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Parkinson's is  
5 the 14th leading cause of death in the United States; and

6           WHEREAS, Approximately one million people in the United States are currently living  
7 with Parkinson's Disease. Every six minutes there is a new Parkinson's Disease diagnosis, every  
8 day 240 people are diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease and each year there are 90,000 new  
9 diagnoses of Parkinson's Disease. There are 3,100 people suffering from Parkinson's Disease  
10 living in Rhode Island; and

11           WHEREAS, Approximately ten percent of Parkinson's Disease diagnoses occur before  
12 the age of 50, with the onset of Parkinson's Disease commonly occurring between the ages of 55  
13 and 65; and

14           WHEREAS, Although research suggests Parkinson's results from a combination of  
15 genetic and environmental factors, the exact cause and progression of the disease is still unknown  
16 and there is no objective test or biomarker with which to diagnose the disease; and

17           WHEREAS, Symptoms of Parkinson's Disease vary from person to person and can  
18 include tremors, slowness, difficulty with balance, swallowing, chewing, speaking, rigidity,  
19 constipation, skin problems, cognitive problems, dementia, and mood disorders such as

1 depression and anxiety; and

2 WHEREAS, Currently there is no known cure or drug to slow or halt the progression of  
3 Parkinson's Disease, and available treatments are limited in their ability to address the medical  
4 needs of patients; and

5 WHEREAS, Increased efforts and awareness are desperately needed to help expedite  
6 research efforts for better treatments, and ultimately a cure, as well as creating enhanced  
7 programs and services to help those impacted by Parkinson's Disease to improve their quality of  
8 life until a cure is found; now, therefore be it

9 RESOLVED, That this Senate of the State of Rhode Island hereby proclaims April of  
10 2023, to be "Parkinson's Awareness Month" in the State of Rhode Island; and be it further

11 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and hereby is authorized and directed to  
12 transmit a duly certified copy of this resolution to the American Parkinson Disease Association,  
13 Rhode Island Chapter.
