FLOOR AMENDMENT TO 2009 -- H 5819

AN ACT RELATING TO BUSINESSES AND PROFESSIONS - TRADE LICENSE RENEWAL SCHEDULES

Mr. Speaker:

I hereby move to amend 2009 -- H 5819, entitled "AN ACT RELATING TO BUSINESSES AND PROFESSIONS - TRADE LICENSE RENEWAL SCHEDULES", as follows:

(1) On page 1, by deleting all of the language after the enactment clause, and by inserting

in place thereof the following:

"SECTION 1. Section 5-20-23 of the General Laws in Chapter 5-20 entitled "Plumbers and Irrigators" is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-20-23. Expiration and renewal of licenses -- Penalties for violation of section. -- (a) All licenses of master plumbers and master irrigators and journeyperson plumbers or journeyperson irrigators issued by the division of professional regulation shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license and may be renewed on or before that date for a period of one year, upon payment of the appropriate renewal fee.

All licenses issued by the division of professional regulation for master plumbers and master irrigators and journeyperson plumbers or journeyperson irrigators born in odd years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in odd years and all licenses of master plumbers and master irrigators and journeyperson plumbers or journeyperson irrigators born in even years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in even years and all licenses may be renewed on or before their expiration date upon payment of the appropriate renewal fee.

- (b) Any master plumber or master irrigator who fails to renew his or her license as provided in subsection (a) of this section may be reinstated by the department on or after the renewal date for a period of one two (2) year years, upon payment of the current bi-annual renewal fee of one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) two hundred forty dollars (\$240) plus outstanding license fees and a twelve dollar (\$12.00) per month administrative assessment fee for the delinquency period.
- (c) Every certificate of license of a journeyperson plumber or journeyperson irrigator issued by the department is renewed on or before the licensee's birthday next following the date of issuance upon payment of a <u>bi-annual</u> renewal fee of thirty-six dollars (\$36.00) seventy-two dollars (\$72.00).
- (d) Any journeyperson plumber or journeyperson irrigator who fails to renew his or her license as provided in subsection (a) of this section may be reinstated by the department on or after the renewal date for a period of one year upon payment of the current <u>bi-annual</u> renewal fee of thirty six dollars (\$36.00) seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) plus outstanding license fees and a twelve dollar (\$12.00) per month administrative assessment fee for the delinquency period.
- (e) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, any license issued under this chapter which is not renewed within two (2) years of the date of its expiration is deemed to be forfeited, and the person to whom the license has been issued is required to make written application for an examination prior to the issuance of a new license.
- SECTION 2. Section 5-70-14 of the General Laws in Chapter 5-70 entitled "Telecommunications" is hereby amended to read as follows:
- <u>5-70-14.</u> Renewal of licenses. -- (a) Application for renewal of a license must be received by the licensing authority, through the department of labor and training, division of professional regulation, on a form provided by the licensing authority no less than thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date of the license, subject to the right of the licensing authority to permit late filing upon good cause shown.
- (b) The licensing authority may refuse to renew a license for any of the grounds stated in this chapter and it shall promptly notify the licensee of its intent to refuse to renew the license. The licensee may, within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the notice of intent to refuse to renew a license, request a hearing on that refusal in the manner prescribed in this chapter. A licensee shall be permitted to continue to engage in the business permitted by the license while its renewal

application is pending.

- (c) Every certificate shall expire on the anniversary of the applicant's birth the year following its issuance issued by the division of professional regulation to license holders born in odd years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in odd years and all licenses issued by the division of professional regulation to license holders born in even years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in even years. An individual may renew his or her license by payment of the required bi-annual renewal fee. An individual who fails to renew his or her license prior to the date may not renew his or her license after this except upon payment of the bi-annual renewal fee and the additional fee required by this chapter.
- <u>5-70-16. Fees. --</u> (a) The fees shall be paid by an applicant for filing an application for examination, for the examination, for annual <u>bi-annual</u> renewal, for renewal of an expired certificate, or for issuance of a duplicate certificate shall be in accordance with a section entitled "Fees", of the <u>bylaws of the board regulations of the department of labor and training.</u>

SECTION 3. Section 28-27-17 of the General Laws in Chapter 28-27 entitled "Mechanical Trades" is hereby amended to read as follows:

28-27-17. Test fees -- License fees -- Expiration and renewal of licenses. -- (a) All licenses issued to the pipefitters/refrigeration technicians and fire protection sprinkler contractor/sprinkler fitters and sheet metal contractor or journeyperson sheet metal worker detailed in this section shall be paid for as follows:

(b)(c) Every license issued by the division of professional regulation is renewable on the licensee's birthdate to license holders born in odd years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in odd years and all licenses issued by the division of professional regulation to license holders born in even years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in even years and all licenses may be renewed on or before their expiration date, upon payment of the appropriate fee. If any credit is due in the initial

changeover year the amount of credit is determined by the chief administrator of the division.

SECTION 4. Section 5-6-16 of the General Laws in Chapter 5-6 entitled "Electricians" is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 5-6-16. License fees. -- (a) All licenses issued by the division of professional regulation for master electricians, all limited license electricians and all journeyperson electricians born in odd years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in odd years and all licenses of master electricians, all limited license electricians and all journeyperson electricians born in even years shall expire on the birthday of the individual qualifying for the license in even years and all licenses may be renewed on or before their expiration date upon payment of the appropriate bi-annual renewal fee.
- (b) A fee of one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) two hundred and forty dollars (\$240) shall be paid by each applicant for an electrical contractor's license Class A; thirty-six dollars (\$36.00) seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) for a journeyperson electrician's license Class B; one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) two hundred and forty dollars (\$240) for a limited premises license Class C; one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) two hundred and forty dollars (\$240) for an oil burner contractor's license Class E; thirty-six dollars (\$36.00) seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) for an oil burnerperson's license Class F; one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) two hundred and forty dollars (\$240) for a fire alarm contractor's license Class AF; thirty-six dollars (\$36.00) seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) for a fire alarm installer's license Class BF; one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) two hundred and forty dollars (\$240) for an electrical sign contractor's license SCF; thirty-six dollars (\$36.00) seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) for a sign installer's license Class CF; and one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) two hundred and forty dollars (\$120) two hundred twenty dollars (\$120) two hundred and forty dollars (\$120) for a limited maintenance license Class D.

A fee of one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) two hundred and forty dollars (\$240) shall be paid by each applicant for a lightning protection contractor's license Class LPC.

A fee of thirty-six dollars (\$36.00) seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) shall be paid by each applicant for a lightning protection installer's license LPI.

SECTION 5. Section 28-26-9 and 28-26-10 of the General Laws in Chapter 28-26 entitled "Hoisting Engineers" are hereby amended to read as follows:

<u>28-26-9.</u> Renewal of license. -- Licenses shall expire annually or biannually on a fixed date or on the licensee's birthday, as the board may provide in rules and regulations. Upon application, the person to whom a license is issued under this chapter shall be entitled to a renewal, unless the division for a cause named in section 28-26-8 and upon notice and hearing shall refuse renewal. Refusal shall have approval of the director.

28-26-10. License fees. -- Each applicant for an examination for a license as an engineer shall pay to the division at the time of application a fee of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00), and for each license or renewal of a license a fee at the annual rate of forty-eight dollars (\$48.00) ninety-six dollars (\$96.00) for a full license, forty-two dollars (\$42.00) eighty-four dollars (\$84.00) for a hoisting license, thirty-six dollars (\$36.00) seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) for an excavating license, and thirty (\$30.00) sixty dollars (\$60.00) for a limited license, these fees to be deposited as general revenues.

SECTION 6. Sections 1 through 5 of this act shall take effect on January 1, 2010 for individuals born in an even year. Section 1 through 5 of this act shall take effect on January 1, 2011 for individuals born in odd years."
