Madam President:

I hereby move to amend 2016 -- S 2118, entitled "AN ACT RELATING TO TOWNS AND CITIES -- EMERGENCY POLICE POWER", as follows:

1. By deleting all the language following the enactment clause, and by inserting in place thereof the following language:

"SECTION 1. Section 45-42-1 of the General Laws in Chapter 45-42 entitled "Emergency Police Power" is hereby amended to read as follows:

45-42-1. Emergency police power. -- (a) When the police chief of a city or town within the state or his or her designee requests emergency police assistance from another <u>city or town</u> police department within the state, the officers responding to the request shall be subject to the authority

of the requesting chief and have the same authority, powers, duties, privileges, and immunities as a duly appointed police officer of the city or town making the request, until the requesting chief of police discharges and releases the assisting police officers to their own <u>city or town</u> departments.

- (b) Law enforcement officers from out-of-state shall have limited emergency police powers to transport, guard and maintain custody of any person who is arrested out of state, but transported to a Rhode Island medical facility for emergency medical treatment. Prior to entry into Rhode Island, the out-of-state police department maintaining custody of said arrested person shall notify the Rhode Island state police of the transport and the site of the emergency medical treatment. The emergency police powers granted shall cease immediately upon the expiration of eight (8) hours from the time of notification, or upon a fugitive-from-justice warrant being executed, whichever shall arise first.
- SECTION 2. Chapter 45-42 of the General Laws entitled "Emergency Police Power" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
- 45-42-3. Mutual aid; Campus police officer. -- (a) Any public or private educational institution of higher learning located in this state, with a police or other public safety department consisting of campus police officers appointed pursuant to chapter 52 of title 16, may enter a mutual aid agreement with the city or town in which the institution is primarily located, solely for the purpose of providing emergency assistance in response to specific incidents at the request of the police chief of the city or town. Officers appointed under this chapter must have satisfactorily completed a training academy certified by the police officer's commission on standards and training.
- (b) The mutual aid agreement will not be effective until formally approved by the city or town council in which the institution is located, after a public hearing and by the governing body

or office of the institution of higher learning.

(c) The special police officers responding to a request for emergency assistance pursuant to a duly approved mutual aid agreement shall have the same authority, powers, duties, privileges, and immunities for jurisdictional purposes as a duly appointed police officer of the city or town making the request.

(d) The special police officers responding to the request for emergency assistance under the mutual aid agreement shall be subject to, and considered within, the control and authority of the requesting chief of police for the duration of the emergency, and until released by the requesting chief of police.

(4) Any individual who holds a green card validly issued by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services and who is at least sixteen (16) years of age and who has in his or her immediate

possession a valid operator's license issued to him or her in his or her country may operate a motor vehicle in this state only as an operator for the duration of the term of the issued green card. However, prior to operating a motor vehicle in this state such individuals qualifying under this section must complete an application provided by the Rhode Island division of motor vehicles and present the Rhode Island division of motor vehicles with a certification from the individual's country's consulate or embassy attesting to the validity of the operator's license issued by his or her country."

(a) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the administrator of the division of motor vehicles is authorized to enter into reciprocal agreements on behalf of the state with the duly authorized representatives of any state of the United States, the District of Columbia, or a state or a province of a foreign country, providing for the registration of vehicles on an apportionment or allocation basis. In exercising this authority, the administrator of the division of motor vehicles is expressly authorized to enter into and to become a member of the International Registration Plan, or any other designation that may, from time to time, be given to such a plan. The administrator of the division of motor vehicles is further authorized to promulgate and to enforce any rules and regulations that may be necessary to carry out the provisions of the International Registration Plan or any other agreement entered into under authority set forth in this section.
- (b) The International Registration Plan, and any other agreement authorized to be entered into by the administrator of the division of motor vehicles, shall take precedence over any state law or regulation that may be in conflict with the aforementioned agreements.
 - (c) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the administrator of the division of motor vehicles

is authorized to enter into operator license agreements or other cooperative arrangements on behalf of the state with the duly authorized representatives of a foreign country or political entities equivalent to Rhode Island state government within a foreign country providing for the reciprocal recognition of operator's licenses. The administrator of the division of motor vehicles shall adopt and enforce rules and regulations setting forth the standards required for such agreements, which said rules and regulations shall contain, at a minimum, that the individual seeking such reciprocity have a valid passport with a legally issued United States visa or green card, a valid operator's license from the country where the individual seeking reciprocity permanently resides with an attached driving record satisfactory to the administrator, a certification from the individual's country's consulate or embassy attesting to the validity of the operator's license issued by his or her country and verification from an employer or academic institution certifying the individual's employment or enrollment."

TO THE HONORABLE, THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE:

In accordance with the provisions of Article IX, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of Rhode Island and Section 43-14 of the Rhode Island General Laws, I transmit, with my disapproval, 2016-S 2540,"An Act Relating to Criminal Offenses- Electronic Imaging Devices."

This legislation is intended to combat "unauthorized dissemination of indecent material," and would criminalize the dissemination of a sexually graphic image of another person without their affirmative consent. The bill also would criminalize the sharing of such images by third parties who know that dissemination occurred without affirmative consent.

The authors of this legislation are attempting to address a very real and serious issue. As digital technology has come to pervade every aspect of our society, opportunities to harass, humiliate, and threaten others have expanded considerably. I strongly support efforts to keep people safe from unwarranted intrusions and exploitation. The State has an interest in protecting the privacy that individuals have a right to enjoy in their personal lives, and in ensuring that the internet and social media are not used for wanton harassment. That is why 26 other states have passed statutes to tamp down on unauthorized electronic dissemination of sexually explicit images.

However, First Amendment lawyers and advocates have expressed concerns that this particular bill is overbroad and vague, and, if enacted, will turn Rhode Island into an outlier on the protection of free speech. While the bill contains exceptions if the image is disseminated "for a lawful purpose" or "in the public interest" or when the dissemination of the image is a "matter of public concern," none of these terms are defined, making it unclear what conduct is prohibited. Ultimately, that determination would be left to a jury in a criminal case. The bill is apparently intended to curb the dissemination of private sexual material over the internet, but its sweep is much broader - it could also cover works of art that depict the human body. And, unlike virtually all other similar state statutes, S 2540 does not include basic safeguards such as the requirement that "intent to harass" be demonstrated for conduct to be criminal.

This breadth and lack of clarity may have a chilling effect on free speech. As many opponents of this bill have noted, this law could criminalize important acts of political speech, such as the sharing of pictures of abuse from Abu Ghraib, wartime atrocities, or humanitarian disasters like famine. The third-party provision of the law imperils any member of the public who might seek to share information that is a in the public domain, not just an individual out for personal revenge.

This legislation could also expose the State to significant litigation risk. First Amendment protections are the bedrock of American civil society. Our courts therefore appropriately demand an extremely high standard for content-based restrictions on speech. Even when states successfully demonstrate that they have a compelling interest in imposing restrictions on speech, they must show that such laws are as narrowly tailored as possible to achieve the desired goal. For all of the reasons previously mentioned, there is a significant chance that this bill would fail that standard, exposing the state to costly and unsuccessful litigation while impeding our broader goal of protecting victims from damaging and unjustified privacy violations.

We do not have to choose between protecting privacy rights and respecting the principles of free speech. The right course of action is to follow the example of other states, and craft a more carefully worded law that specifically addresses the problem of revenge porn, without implicating other types of constitutionally protected speech. I would welcome the opportunity to work with victims' advocates, the Attorney General, and the General Assembly to introduce such a bill in the next legislative session.

TO THE HONORABLE, THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE:

In accordance with the provisions of Article IX, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of Rhode Island and Section 43-1-4 of the Rhode Island General Laws, I transmit, with my disapproval, 2016 S 2877,"An Act Relating to Motor and Other Vehicles - Operators' And Chauffeurs' Licenses."

Under current law, a foreign national with a valid operator's license from his or her home country may operate a motor vehicle in this state. This bill would create an additional requirement for foreign nationals with an active work visa, study visa or green card. They would have to complete an application provided by the Rhode Island Division of Motor Vehicles and obtain a certification from their country's consulate or embassy attesting to the validity of their operator's license. The bill also provides a system for reciprocal recognition of operator licenses between Rhode Island and other countries.

The United States is a signatory to the 1949 Geneva Convention on Road Traffic, an international treaty that establishes certain uniform rules governing use of the roads in signatory countries. Chapter V, article 24 (1) of the Convention permits any driver over 18 holding a valid license issued by a signatory to the Convention to drive in another signatory country "without further examination." International treaties must be liberally construed to effectuate their purpose. The additional application and certification requirements of this bill are at odds with the Convention's purpose of simplifying and unifying driving regulations on an international level. As such, these restrictions limit rights granted by the Convention and thereby violate the Supremacy Clause of the United States Constitution.

Despite the constitutional infirmities with the bill's application and certification requirements, I fully support reciprocal recognition of foreign drivers' licenses. Such reciprocal recognition is good for economic development and I applaud Senator Da Ponte for his leadership on this issue. I look forward to working with the sponsors of the House and Senate versions of this bill to craft a constitutional bill authorizing a reciprocal recognition system for introduction in the next session.

For these reasons, I disapprove of this legislation and respectfully urge your support of this veto.

TO THE HONORABLE, THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE:

In accordance with the provisions of article IX, section 14 of the Constitution of the State of Rhode Island and section 43-1-4 of the Rhode Island General Laws, I transmit, with my disapproval, 2016-S 2375 As Amended, "An Act Relating to Insurance Unfair Claims Settlement Practices Act."

This legislation expands the definition of the State's Unfair Claims Settlement Practices Act to include an insurer's refusal to compensate a rental car company for the loss of use of a damaged rental vehicle irrespective of whether the rental car company sustained any actual financial harm due to the loss of use. This is a change from current law, which does not require compensation for rental car companies absent evidence of financial loss resulting from an inability to rent the damaged rental car.

The contemplated change to this fundamental relationship between the insurer and the claimant would be extraordinary -essentially requiring insurers make payment for a loss without being provided with proof that a loss was actually sustained. Accordingly, this proposal runs counter to a bedrock principle of insurance: that insurers should only compensate claimants for actual

financial damages sustained. What's more, it appears that Rhode Island would become the first state in the nation to place such constraints on insurers.

Proponents of this legislation seek to prevent insurance companies from establishing onerous barriers to rental car companies proving actual damages from loss of use. However, the bill before me today goes a step too far, removing any need for a rental car company to prove loss whatsoever and simply entitling them to compensation. This bill would make Rhode Island an outlier in this area and would likely drive costs up for insurers across the state, translating into higher premiums for consumers. This bill also could incentivize companies to delay repairing damaged rental cars because insurers would be forced to pay the loss of use claim lest they be

accused of committing an Unfair claims settlement Practice. Under such circumstances, I cannot support this legislation in its current form.

Nevertheless, the proponents of this legislation have identified an important problem that we can address in a more narrowly tailored way. Accordingly, I am directing the Department of Business Regulation to work with rental car and insurance companies to identify common-sense changes to the regulations governing their interactions to ensure that no unfair barriers exist to a company pursuing a loss of use claim and to prevent insurance companies from necessarily delaying assessment and payment of those claims to the detriment of rental car companies. This will modernize and streamline compliance on both sides of the equation- claimant and insurer alike.

I am focused on improving Rhode Island's economy and making it easier to do business herethat is why I worked closely with the Department of Business Regulation and the General Assembly to enact the Premium Jobs Initiative, a new law that encourages insurance companies to locate and grow jobs in our State. Allowing the proposal before me today to become would undo much of the progress that we have made during this legislative session to make our more attractive to insurers - sending precisely the wrong message to an industry that is critical economic comeback.

For these reasons, I disapprove of this legislation and respectfully urge your support of this veto.
