#### AN ACT

#### RELATING TO EDUCATION -- CELL PHONES IN SCHOOL

<u>Introduced By:</u> Representatives Petrarca, Winfield, O`Neill, Brien, and Palumbo <u>Date Introduced:</u> January 18, 2012 <u>Referred To:</u> House Health, Education & Welfare

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 16-21 of the General Laws entitled "Health and Safety of Pupils" is
hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
16-21-35. Texting in school restricted (a) The Rhode Island department of
elementary and secondary education shall prescribe by regulation a statewide policy restricting
texting during school hours. For purposes of this section, "school hours" shall mean those hours
which encompass the period when classes are normally in session at the school and for which
students are to be in attendance, as well as such ancillary times that are part of the traditional
school day, including, but not limited to, homeroom, study hall periods, lunch and recess.
(b) The statewide policy shall apply to all schools that are approved and accredited by the
board of regents for elementary and secondary education, pursuant to of subdivision 16-60-4(10)
and shall contain the following:
(1) The definition of and statement(s) prohibiting texting, except in an emergency of
health and/or safety and except for educational or instructional purposes, with prior approval from
school administration.
(2) A provision that states disciplinary actions for violations of the texting policy shall be
determined by the school's appropriate authority; however, no student shall be suspended from
school solely based upon a violation of this texting policy.
(3) A provision stating that no cell phone shall be taken from the student for a period
beyond the school day of the offense.

- (4) A provision stating that school officials cannot view the contents of a cell phone
  unless authorized by law or unless said official has a reasonable belief that the cell phone was
- 3 used to violate another school policy, such as cheating or bullying and only to the extent
- 4 <u>necessary to verify the existence of the specific text at issue.</u>
- 5 (c) All schools that are approved and accredited pursuant to subdivision 16-60-4(10) for
- 6 the purpose of section 16-19-1 shall be subject to the requirements of this section. School districts
- 7 and schools must adopt the statewide texting policy promulgated pursuant to this subsection by
- 8 <u>June 31, 2013.</u>

- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
