It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 30-15-6 of the General Laws in Chapter 30-15 entitled "Emergency
2	Management" is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	30-15-6. Advisory council (a) There is hereby created the Rhode Island emergency
4	management advisory council (hereinafter in this chapter called the "council"). The council will
5	consist of forty (40) forty-two (42) members as follows:
6	(1) Twenty-two (22) Twenty-three (23) ex officio members as follows:
7	(i) The lieutenant governor;
8	(ii) The adjutant general;
9	(iii) The director of administration/statewide planning;
10	(iv) The director of health;
11	(v) The director of transportation;
12	(vi) The director of human services;
13	(vii) The superintendent of state police;
14	(viii) The public utilities administrator;
15	(ix) The director of the department of environmental management;
16	(x) The director of mental health, retardation, behavioral healthcare, developmental
17	disabilities and hospitals;
18	(xi) The director of elderly affairs;
19	(xii) The chairperson of the state water resources board;

1	(xiii) The chairperson of the governor's commission on disabilities;
2	(xiv) The chairperson of the Rhode Island public transit authority;
3	(xv) The executive director of the coastal resources management council or his or her
4	designee;
5	(xvi) The executive director of the American Red Cross, Rhode Island chapter;
6	(xvii) The executive director of the Rhode Island emergency management agency;
7	(xviii) The state court administrator;
8	(xix) The executive director of the commission on the deaf and hard of hearing;
9	(xx) The director of the Providence emergency management agency;
10	(xxi) The executive director of E-911 emergency telephone system division;
11	(xxii) The federal security director of the transportation security administration for
12	Rhode Island; and
13	(xxiii) The state building code commissioner; and
14	(2) Eighteen (18) Nineteen (19) members appointed by and serving at the pleasure of the
15	governor, as follows:
16	(i) Two (2) members of the senate, recommended by the president of the senate, not
17	more than one of whom shall be from the same political party;
18	(ii) Two (2) members of the house of representatives, recommended by the speaker of
19	the house, not more than one of whom shall be from the same political party;
20	(iii) One representative of the electric industry;
21	(iv) One representative of the gas industry;
22	(v) One representative of the telephone industry;
23	(vi) The executive director of the Rhode Island petroleum association or other similarly
24	situated person;
25	(vii) Two (2) representatives of the general public, one who shall have expertise in
26	disaster preparedness;
27	(viii) One representative of the Rhode Island league of cities and towns;
28	(ix) One representative of the media;
29	(x) One representative of the water supply industry;
30	(xi) One representative of the health care industry;
31	(xii) One representative of the Rhode Island firefighters association;
32	(xiii) One representative of the Rhode Island association of fire chiefs;
33	(xiv) One representative of a private ambulance company; and
34	(xv) One representative of a level I trauma hospital who shall have direct expertise in

1	disaster preparedness-; and
2	(xvi) One representative of the Rhode Island Association of Emergency Managers.
3	(b) It shall be the duty of the council to advise the governor and the adjutant general or
4	all matters pertaining to disaster preparedness. The lieutenant governor shall serve as chairperson
5	of the council and the adjutant general shall serve as vice-chairperson. In providing advice to the
6	governor and the adjutant general, the council shall, among other matters reasonably related to
7	their authority, do the following:
8	(1) Establish a regular meeting schedule and form subcommittees as may be appropriate;
9	(2) Review emergency management plans and other matters as may be acted upon or
10	otherwise provided for in this chapter;
11	(3) Establish priorities and goals on emergency management matters on an annual basis;
12	(4) Study emergency management plans in conjunction with the adjutant general, and
13	otherwise conduct such other studies as may be deemed appropriate;
14	(5) Review the coordination of the state's emergency management programs with
15	appropriate authorized agencies and conduct studies on the programs as may be necessary;
16	(6) Review the plans and operations of the various cities and towns in disaster
17	preparedness in conjunction with the director and his or her office as required or necessary; and
18	(7) [Deleted by P.L. 2000, ch. 170, section 2];
19	(8) Provide an annual report on its activities in conjunction with the adjutant general.
20	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
