RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY - OUTDOOR WOOD-FIRED HYDRONIC HEATERS

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Title 23 of the General Laws entitled "HEALTH AND SAFETY" is hereby
2	amended by adding thereto the following chapter:
3	CHAPTER 23.7
4	OUTDOOR WOOD-FIRED HYDRONIC HEATERS
5	23-23.7-1. Purpose The general assembly hereby finds and declares that outdoor
6	wood-fired hydronic heaters, also known as outdoor wood-burning boilers or outdoor wood
7	boilers may be recognized as a source of air pollution. Emissions from outdoor wood heaters that
8	are a result of improper use or maintenance may have adverse health effects. The purpose of this
9	chapter is to protect the public health, safety and welfare while maintaining homeowners' rights
10	to choose to heat their homes with a safe, economical, and ecologically plentiful fuel source.
11	23-23.7-2. Definitions. – The following words when used in this chapter shall have the
12	following meaning:
13	(1) "Clean wood" means wood that has not been painted, stained, coated, preserved, or
14	treated with chemicals, including, but not limited to, copper chromium arsenate, creosote, and
15	pentachlorophenol. This definition does not include construction or demolition debris as defined
16	<u>in subdivision 23-18.9-7(4).</u>
17	(2) "DEM Director" means the director of the department of environmental management
18	or designee.

1	(3) "DOH Director" means the director of the department of health, or designee.
2	(4) "EPA" means the United States Environmental Protection Agency.
3	(5) "Municipality" means a city or town. Municipality shall not mean village, or fire
4	district.
5	(6) "Outdoor wood-fired hydronic heater", or "OHH" means a device:
6	(i) Designed to burn wood or other solid fuels;
7	(ii) That the manufacturer specifies for outdoor installation or in structures not normally
8	occupied by humans; and
9	(iii) That heats building space and/or water through distribution through pipes of a fluid,
10	typically water or a mixture of water and antifreeze, heated by the device.
11	(7) "Phase 2 outdoor wood-fired hydronic heater" means an outdoor wood-fired hydronic
12	heater that has been certified or qualified by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as
13	meeting a particulate matter emission limit of 0.32 pounds per million British Thermal Units
14	(BTUs) output and is labeled accordingly with an EPA label.
15	(8) "Person" means any individual, partnership, firm or co-partnership, association,
16	company, trust, corporation, department, bureau, agency, private or municipal authority, or any
17	political subdivision of the state, the United States and or political subdivisions thereof, or any
18	other entity recognized by law as subject to rights and duties.
19	23-23.7-3. Use or installation prohibited (a) Effective upon passage, no person may
20	use, allow to be used or install an OHH on property of a lot size less than one half (1/2) of one
21	acre, or twenty-one thousand seven hundred eighty (21,780) square feet unless the subject lot is
22	surrounded on all sides by state-owned management property, conservation-owned property or
23	other property as to be deemed unbuildable.
24	(b) No person shall sell, offer for sale – be it public or private sale – or install an OHH
25	that is not a Phase 2 OHH for use in Rhode Island.
26	23-23.7-4. Setback and stack height requirements No person shall install an OHH
27	unless it: (1) Is installed at least fifty feet (50') from the nearest property line and seventy-five
28	feet (75') from the nearest occupied building of an abutting owner; and
29	(2) Is set back from the building it services in accordance to any manufacturer's
30	recommendations and;
31	(3) Has a permanently attached stack that is at least two feet (2') higher than the height of
32	all occupied structures that are located within one-hundred fifty (150') feet of the OHH.
33	23-23.7-5. Manner of installation No person shall install an OHH unless he or she
34	first obtains all required permits from the appropriate authority for all mechanical, electrical and

plumbing elements of the installation	and these installations are approved and signed by said
authority upon completion of the instal	<u>llation.</u>
23-23.7-6. Permitted fuels	- (a) No fuel except the following shall be burned in a
outdoor wood-fired hydronic heater:	
(1) Clean wood;	
(2) Wood pellets made from cl	ean wood;
(3) Home heating oil, natural	gas, or propane that complies with all applicable sulfur
limits and is used as a starter or supplemental fuel for a dual-fired outdoor wood-fired hydronic	
heater;	
(4) Any other fuel approve	d by the DEM director pursuant to duly-promulgated
regulations.	
(b) Outdoor wood-fired hydro	onic heaters specifically designed to burn wood pellet fuel
with metered fuel and air feed and con	trolled combustion engineering that are operated according
to manufacturer's specifications and t	hat burn only wood pellet fuel shall be exempt from the
provisions of this chapter.	
23-23.7-7. Limitations on allo	owable fuels. – No person shall cause or allow any material
to be burned in an OHH heater forbidd	en in section 23-23.7-6.
23-23.7-8. Municipal ordinal	nces Cities and towns shall have the authority and duty
to enact and enforce ordinances that	regulate the installation and use of OHH devices. Such
ordinances shall establish setbacks ar	nd stack heights that are suitable to zoning and planning
guidelines of said municipalities that	are equal to, or more stringent than those set forth in this
<u>chapter.</u>	
23-23.7-9. Nuisance clause.	If the owner or operator of an outdoor wood-fired
hydronic heater as defined in this chap	oter operates the OHH in a manner which causes a nuisance
or is injurious to the public health, the	ne municipality may, in writing, order that the use of the
OHH shall be discontinued until the	cause of the nuisance has been rectified in the prescribed
manner indicated by the written ord	er. The DEM director, and DOH director shall provide
technical assistance to the municipal	authorities in the determination of, declaration of, and
enforcement of the nuisance provision	under this section.
23-23.7-10. Local enforcement	nt The responsibility for the enforcement of this chapter
shall be with the local municipal bui	ilding authority or such other local building official as a
municipality may designate by ordinan	ice.
23-23.7-11. Notice to buyers	(a) Prior to the execution of a sale for a new or used
OHH, the distributor/seller shall prov	ide the prospective buyer with a copy of this chapter and

1	written notice which includes;	
2	(1) An acknowledgement that the buyer was provided with a copy of this chapter as well	
3	as DEM Air Pollution Control Regulation No. 48;	
4	(2) The current list of phase 2 outdoor wood boiler models that qualify for the EPA's	
5	outdoor wood-fired hydronic heater program;	
6	(3) A list of approved fuels;	
7	(4) A statement that even if the requirements set forth in this chapter are met, there may	
8	8 <u>be ordinances imposed by the buyer's municipality or findings of adverse effects by the director</u>	
9	of DEM or the director of DOH that may limit or prohibit the use of the purchased OHH.	
10	(b) The notice shall be signed and dated by the buyer and the distributor/seller when the	
11	sale of the OHH is completed. The name and address of owner, name of the manufacturer, and	
12	the model and date of manufacture of the OHH shall be included in the completed notice.	
13	(c) A copy of the signed written notice required pursuant to subsection (b) above, shall be	
14	kept on file by the municipal building authority in which the OHH will be installed for a period	
15	not less than three (3) years from the date of approval of the building permit.	
16	(d) If the sale is a private, or out of state sale, it will be incumbent upon the building	
17	official of the municipality in which the OHH will be installed to provide the documents listed in	
18	subsection 23-23.11(a) and follow the acknowledgement procedure in subsection 23-23.11(b)	
19	prior to issuing a building permit for the installation.	
20	23-23.7-12. Common law rights preserved. – The operation or use of an outdoor wood-	
21	fired hydronic heater in any manner that creates a nuisance or interferes with the health, safety, or	
22	welfare of any person is prohibited. All public or private rights of action in nuisance, negligence,	
23	or otherwise are preserved.	
24	4 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
