RELATING TO EDUCATION -- CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 16-1 of the General Laws entitled "State Department of Elementary
2	and Secondary Education" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
3	16-1-16. Transfer of due process hearings to the department of health (a)
4	Notwithstanding any statute, law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the process of resolving
5	disputes relating to the identification, evaluation or educational placement of children with
6	disabilities and providing a free and appropriate education, as defined in section 16-24-1, known
7	as "due process" hearings, shall be transferred to the department of health.
8	(b) The director of the department of health shall implement regulations relating to all
9	hearing procedures and appeals, including, but not limited to, appointment of qualified hearing
10	officers, in strict accordance with state and federal law.
11	(c) All costs associated with the conduct of hearings pursuant to this section shall be
12	borne by the department of elementary and secondary education.
13	SECTION 2. Section 23-1-17 of the General Laws in Chapter 23-1 entitled "Department
14	of Health" is hereby amended to read as follows:
15	23-1-17. Additional general powers (a) In addition to the other powers given to the
16	director of health or the department of health by other provisions of the general laws, and in order
17	to permit the director to properly perform the duties given to him or her by the general assembly,
18	and to enforce the rules and regulations the director is authorized to promulgate and adopt, the
19	director is further authorized to promulgate and adopt rules and regulations for the establishment

of information collection, minimum sanitary requirements, and other duties given to the director

by section 23-1-1 or by any other provision of law, and to enforce those rules and regulations; and

3 the director is further authorized to promulgate and adopt rules and regulations relating to the

conduct of due process hearings relating to providing children with disabilities a free and

appropriate education, and other duties given to the director by section 16-1-16, or by any other

provisions of law, and to enforce those rules and regulations. The director is further authorized to

issue licenses or permits, and to revoke, suspend, or annul them, to aid in the enforcement of

8 those rules and regulations.

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(b) In the event of a public health emergency, the director is authorized to grant a

temporary Rhode Island health care provider license for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days

and limited to those health care providers who hold an active valid license in another state. The

director is authorized to promulgate and adopt rules and regulations to establish a process for this

temporary emergency license.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.

This act would transfer "due process" hearings relating to the education of children with disabilities from the department of elementary and secondary education to the department of health.
