HOUSE RESOLUTION

RESPECTFULLY REQUESTING THAT THE RHODE ISLAND CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION INTRODUCE LEGISLATION MAKING IT A CRIME OF MANSLAUGHTER FOR A DRUG COMPANY TO REFUSE TO MANUFACTURE CANCER DRUGS DUE TO PROFIT MOTIVATIONS

1 WHEREAS, Millions of American citizens, including children, suffer from cancer. For 2 many of these sufferers, their survivability is at the mercy of their access to life-preserving drug 3 medications; and WHEREAS, One example of a dire situation is the current shortage of the cancer drug 4 5 Methotrexate, a drug that often represents the difference between life and death for millions of 6 children suffering from Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia, as well as a type of bone cancer called 7 Osteogenic Sarcoma. Many hospitals around the nation are once perilously close to running out 8 of Methotrexate; and 9 WHEREAS, Shortages can occur when a single manufacturer produces a certain drug 10 and then shuts down temporarily. A shortage may also take place when a drug manufacturer fails 11 to produce medication in large quantities because of small profit margins; and 12 WHEREAS, Shortages in the supply of cancer medications that result from drug manufacturers' decisions to maximize their profits and that lead to the deaths of innocent patients 13 14 should be treated as a crime. Lives are literally at stake and it is beyond reprehensible for any 15 drug company to not produce these drugs due to concerns over profits; now, therefore be it 16 RESOLVED, That this House of Representatives of the State of Rhode Island and 17 Providence Plantations hereby respectfully requests that the Rhode Island Congressional

Delegation introduce legislation making it a crime of manslaughter if a cancer patient dies as a
