1	WHEREAS, Catholic schools ensure a complete academic and values-based education
2	emphasizing the moral, intellectual, physical, and social development of young people throughout
3	Rhode Island and the nation; and
4	WHEREAS, Catholic schools produce students who are strongly dedicated to their faith,
5	values, families, and communities, by providing a safe, disciplined, and intellectually stimulating
6	environment rich in spiritual character and moral development for children of every creed and
7	color; and
8	WHEREAS, Rhode Island's Catholic schools are acclaimed for their academic
9	excellence. Their elementary school students consistently score above the norm in national
10	standardized tests in all subject areas, and their high school graduation rate is nearly 100 percent,
11	with almost 95 percent of those graduates going on to college; and
12	WHEREAS, There are currently 43 Catholic elementary schools in the state with an
13	enrollment of an estimated 15,000 students; and
14	WHEREAS, Rhode Island Catholic schools teach a diverse group of students and have
15	provided more than \$1 million in tuition assistance to low-income families; and
16	WHEREAS, Educational research demonstrates that Catholic schools, better than any
17	other type of school, successfully close the learning achievement gap between children from high
18	and low socioeconomic groups; and

WHEREAS, Catholic schools provide millions of dollars in education and construction

2	WHEREAS, Catholic school alumni, students, teachers, and parents contribute to, are
3	involved in, and are dedicated to the life of their parishes and communities well beyond their
4	numbers; and
5	WHEREAS, The 1997 Congregation of Catholic Education in Rome stated in their letter
6	on Catholic School on the Threshold of the Third Millennium: "The Catholic school, therefore,
7	undertakes a cordial and constructive dialogue with states and civil authorities. Such dialogue
8	and collaboration must be based on mutual respect, on the reciprocal recognition of each other's
9	role and on a common service to mankind. To achieve this end, the Catholic school willingly
10	occupies its place within the school system of the different countries and in the legislation of the
11	individual states, when the latter respect the fundamental tights of the human person, starting with
12	respect for life and religious freedom"; now, therefore, be it
13	RESOLVED, That this House of Representatives of the State of Rhode Island and
14	Providence Plantations hereby proclaims March 8 th of 2012 to be "Catholic Schools Day" in the
15	State of Rhode Island; and be it further
16	RESOLVED, That we applaud the efforts and support the goals of Rhode Island
17	"Catholic Schools Day," an event sponsored by the Rhode Island Catholic Schools Parents
18	Federation. We furthermore congratulate the students, parents, teachers, and administrators for
19	their ongoing contributions to the education of Rhode Island's youth, and for the key role they
20	play in promoting and ensuring a brighter, stronger future for the State of Rhode Island; and be it
