1 WHEREAS, A healthy environment is an integral part of Rhode Island's economy, 2 society, and culture; and 3 WHEREAS, For more than thirty years, the Endangered Species Act has served as the 4 nation's safety net for wildlife, saving hundreds of plants and animals from extinction, putting hundreds more on the path to recovery, and safeguarding the habitats on which they all depend; 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, Saving a species requires a combination of sound research, careful 8 coordination, and intensive management of conservation efforts, along with increased public 9 awareness and education; and 10 WHEREAS, Education and increasing public awareness are the first steps in effectively 11 informing the public about endangered species and species restoration efforts; and 12 WHEREAS, Species extinction and habitat destruction are a serious threat to our own 13 welfare, as nature is the source for most of our commonly-prescribed medicines, and the loss of species could mean the loss of life-saving drugs; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Protecting Rhode Island's and America's wildlife and plants today is the legacy we leave to our children and grandchildren. We have the responsibility of ensuring that 16 future generations will not only have use of the best available science, but will also be able to 17 18 delight in experiencing the rich variety of native species that have helped to define our Ocean 1 RESOLVED, That this House of Representatives of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations hereby proclaims May 18th of 2012 to be "Endangered Species Day" in 2 3 the State of Rhode Island.
