RELATING TO ANIMALS AND ANIMAL HUSBANDRY -- IMPORTATION OF WILD ANIMALS

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 4-18-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 4-18 entitled "Importation
 of Wild Animals" is hereby amended to read as follows:

<u>4-18-3. Permit required to import wild animals. --</u> (a) No person shall import into,
receive, or possess in this state without first obtaining a permit from the department, animals of
the following orders, families, and genera: primates, carnivores, amphibia, reptilia, canidae, and
insecta. The director may by regulation designate additional orders, families, genera, or species
requiring a permit to import, receive or possess; or the director may by regulation waive the
permit requirement for specific species, orders, families and genera.

9 (b) Any animal care facility accredited by the American zoo and aquarium association 10 (AZA) shall be exempt from this provision, provided, however, the facility provides the state 11 veterinarian with a quarterly summary of any and all animal acquisitions and dispositions.

- 12 (c) Notwithstanding any provisions of subsections (a) or (b), no person shall be permitted
- 13 to own any of the following: alligator(s), crocodile(s), python(s), and boa constrictor(s).
- 14 <u>Ownership shall be punishable by a fine of not less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000).</u>
- 15 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMALS AND ANIMAL HUSBANDRY -- IMPORTATION OF WILD ANIMALS

This act would prohibit the ownership of alligators, crocodiles, pythons and boa
 constrictors. Ownership shall be punishable by a fine of not less than one thousand dollars.

3 This act would take effect upon passage.
