- It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows: 1 SECTION 1. Section 40-9.1-1.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 40-9.1 entitled "Equal 2 Rights of Blind and Deaf Persons to Public Facilities" is hereby amended to read as follows: 3 40-9.1-1.1. Definitions. -- (a) "Guide dog" means a dog that has been or is being specially trained to aid a particular blind or visually impaired person. 4 5 (b) "Hearing dog" means a dog that has been or is being specially trained to aid a 6 particular deaf or hard-of-hearing person. 7 (c) "Housing accommodations" means any real property or portion thereof that is used or 8 occupied, or intended, arranged or designed to be used or occupied, as the home, residence or 9 sleeping place of one or more human beings, but does not include any single-family residence the 10 occupants of which rent, lease or furnish for compensation to more than one room therein. 11 (d) "Personal assistance animal" means a dog that has been or is being trained as a guide 12 dog, hearing dog or service dog. 13
 - (e) "Service dog" means a dog that has been or is being specially trained to aid a particular disabled person with a disability other than sight or hearing.
- (f) "Disabled" means a disability as defined in section 42-87-1.

- (g) "Closed-captioning" means a transcript or dialog of the audio portion of a television
 program that is displayed on a television receiver screen when the user activates the feature.
- (h) "Public area" means a part of a place of public accommodation that is open to the

1	general public.
2	(i) "Regular hours" means the hours of any day in which a place of public
3	accommodation is open to members of the general public.
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 40-9.1 of the General Laws entitled "Equal Rights of Blind and
5	Deaf Persons to Public Facilities" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
6	40-9.1-6. Closed-captioning activation required. – (a) On request, a place of public
7	accommodation shall keep closed-captioning activated on any closed-captioning television
8	receiver that is in use during regular hours in any public area.
9	(b) This section does not require a place of public accommodation to make closed-
10	captioning available in a public area at the place of public accommodation if:
11	(1) No television receiver of any kind is available in the public area; or
12	(2) The only public television receiver available in the public area is not a closed-
13	captioning television receiver.
14	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

This act would require a place of public accommodation upon request, to keep closed—captioning activated on a television used in public areas during regular hours, if the television is capable of such display.
