RELATING TO SPORTS, RACING AND ATHLETICS - MUTUEL BETTING AND LICENSE FEES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 41-4-2 of the General Laws in Chapter 41-4 entitled "Mutuel
 Betting and License Fees" is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 3 41-4-2. Betting only at track -- Minors prohibited Betting only at track -- Minors under age twenty-one (21) prohibited. -- The pari-mutuel system, so-called, or other form of 4 5 betting system authorized by this chapter, shall not be used or permitted at any location other than 6 the race track at which the horse racing event is licensed to be conducted. No licensee shall 7 knowingly permit any minor person under age twenty-age (21) to be a patron of the pari-mutuel 8 system or other betting system authorized by this chapter. 9 SECTION 2. Section 41-11-4 of the General Laws in Chapter 41-11 entitled "Simulcast 10 Programs from Licensed Betting Facilities" is hereby amended to read as follows: 41-11-4. Admission of minors prohibited Admission of minors under age twenty-one 11 12 (21) prohibited. -- No person who is under the age of eighteen (18) twenty-one (21) years shall be admitted into a building where pari-mutuel betting or simulcast is taking place, unless the 13 14 person is an employee of a licensed concessionaire or licensed vendor and performing his or her 15 duties of employment. SECTION 3. Chapter 41-9.1 of the General Laws entitled "The Rhode Island Gaming 16 Control and Revenue Act" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 17
- 18 <u>41-9.1-28.1. Minors under age twenty-one (21) prohibited. (a) No casino or slot</u>

- 1 parlor licensee shall knowingly permit any person under age twenty-one (21) to be a patron of the
- 2 <u>casino or slot parlor.</u>
- 3 (b) If any individual is convicted of underage gambling, it shall be deemed to be a
- 4 disorderly persons offense and shall be fined a minimum of one hundred dollars (\$100) and not
- 5 more than five hundred dollars (\$500). In addition, the individual's driver's license shall be
- 6 <u>suspended for six (6) months.</u>
- 7 (c) If the individual is under the age of seventeen (17) and has not yet obtained a driver's
- 8 license, the issuance of that person's driver's license shall be postponed for six (6) months.
- 9 (d) If a parent or a person who has custody or control of a person under the age of
- 10 twenty-one (21) allows an underage individual to gamble, that person shall be charged with a
- 11 disorderly person's offense and the penalties shall be the same as paragraph (a) of this section.
- 12 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

This act would increase the legal age for gambling from eighteen (18) to twenty-one (21)
 years of age at any facility where there is a pari-mutuel system, casinos or slot parlors. This act
 also provides penalties which would include fines and loss of a driver's license for underage
 gambling.
