It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 42-17.1-2.5 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-17.1 entitled
"Department of Environmental Management" is hereby amended to read as follows:

<u>42-17.1-2.5.</u> Tolling of expiration periods. -- (a) Notwithstanding any other provision set forth in this chapter, all periods pertaining to the expiration of any approval or permit issued pursuant to any state statute or any regulation promulgated thereto pertaining to the development of property shall be tolled until June 30, <u>2013</u> <u>2015</u>. For the purposes of this section, "tolling" means the suspension or temporary stopping of the running of the applicable permit or approval period.

(b) Said tolling need not be recorded in the land evidence records to be valid; however, a notice of the tolling must be posted in the municipal planning department and near the land evidence records.

(c) The tolling shall apply only to approvals or permits in effect on November 9, 2009 and those issued between November 9, 2009 and June 30, 2013 and shall not revive expired approvals or permits.

(d) The expiration dates for all permits and approvals issued before the tolling period began will be recalculated as of July 1, 2013 2015 by adding thereto the number of days between November 9, 2009 and the day on which the permit or approval would otherwise have expired. The expiration dates for all permits and approvals issued during the tolling period will be

2	permit or approval was issued and the day the permit or approval otherwise would have expired.
3	SECTION 2. Section 45-23-63.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 45-23 entitled
4	"Subdivision of Land" is hereby amended to read as follows:
5	45-23-63.1. Procedure Tolling of expiration periods (a) Notwithstanding any
6	other provision set forth in this chapter, all periods pertaining to the expiration of any approval
7	issued pursuant to the local regulations promulgated under this chapter shall be tolled until June
8	30, 2013 2015. For the purposes of this section, "tolling" shall mean the suspension or temporary
9	stopping of the running of the applicable permit or approval period.
10	(b) Said tolling need not be recorded in the land evidence records to be valid; however, a
11	notice of the tolling must be posted in the municipal planning department and near the land
12	evidence records.
13	(c) The tolling shall apply only to approvals or permits in effect on November 9, 2009
14	and those issued between November 9, 2009 and June 30, 2013, and shall not revive expired
15	approvals.
16	(d) The expiration dates for all permits and approvals issued before the tolling period
17	began will be recalculated as of July 1, 2013 2015 by adding thereto the number of days between
18	November 9, 2009 and the day on which the permit or approval would otherwise have expired.
19	The expiration dates for all permits and approvals issued during the tolling period will be
20	recalculated as of July 1, 2013 2015 by adding thereto the number of days between the day the
21	permit or approval was issued and the day the permit or approval otherwise would have expired.
22	SECTION 3. Section 46-23-6.3 of the General Laws in Chapter 46-23 entitled "Coastal
23	Resources Management Council" is hereby amended to read as follows:
24	46-23-6.3. Tolling of expiration periods (a) Notwithstanding any other provision set
25	forth in this chapter, all periods pertaining to the expiration of any approval or permit issued
26	pursuant to any state statute or any regulation promulgated thereto pertaining to the development
27	of property shall be tolled until June 30, 2013 2015. For the purposes of this section, "tolling"
28	means the suspension or temporary stopping of the running of the applicable permit or approval
29	period.
30	(b) Said tolling need not be recorded in the land evidence records to be valid, however, a
31	notice of the tolling must be posted in the municipal planning department and near the land
32	evidence records.
33	(c) The tolling shall apply only to approvals or permits in effect on November 9, 2009
34	and those issued between November 9, 2009 and June 30, 2013, 2015, and shall not revive expired

approvals or permits.

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2 (d) The expiration dates for all permits and approvals issued before the tolling period
3 began will be recalculated as of July 1, 2013 2015 by adding thereto the number of days between
4 November 9, 2009 and the day on which the permit or approval would otherwise have expired.
5 The expiration dates for all permits and approvals issued during the tolling period will be
6 recalculated as of July 1, 2013 2015 by adding thereto the number of days between the day the
7 permit or approval was issued and the day the permit or approval otherwise would have expired.
8 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon passage and shall apply to approvals and

permits in effect on November 9, 2009, and those issued between November 9, 2009, and June

30, 2015, but shall not revive any expired approval or permit.
