It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 11-47-24 of the General Laws in Chapter 11-47 entitled "Weapons
--

- 2 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- <u>11-47-24. Alteration of marks of identification on firearms. -- (a)</u> No person shall
 change, alter, remove, or obliterate the name of the maker, model, manufacturer's number, or
 other mark of identification on any firearm.
- 6 (b) No person shall receive, transport, or possess any firearm which has had any maker,
- 7 model, manufacturer's number or other mark of identification removed, altered, or obliterated.
- 8 (c) Possession of any firearm upon which any of these marks shall have been changed,
- 9 altered, removed, or obliterated shall be prima facie evidence that the possessor has changed,
- 10 altered, removed, or obliterated it.
- 11 (d) Violation of the provisions of this section may be punished by imprisonment for not
- 12 more than five (5) years.
- 13 (e) This section shall not apply to antique and collectible weapons legally possessed by
- 14 <u>collectors and dealers of firearms as provided in section 11-47-25.</u>
- 15 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL OFFENSES

1 This act would make it unlawful for any person to receive, transport or possess any 2 firearm which has had any maker, model, manufacturer's number or other mark of identification 3 removed, altered, or obliterated, except for antique and collectible weapons legally possessed by 4 collectors and dealers of firearms. 5 This act would take effect upon passage.
