### AN ACT

#### RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES - PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 39-1-37.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 39-1 entitled "Public 1 2 Utilities Commission" is hereby amended to read as follows: 3 39-1-37.1. Ratepayers advisory board. -- (a) There is hereby established the ratepayers 4 advisory board. The advisory board shall consist of the following public members: 5 (1) Three (3) Four (4) members appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, one of whom shall represent the interests of residential ratepayers; one of whom shall represent 6 7 the interests of the elderly and disabled; and one of whom shall represent a community-based consumer organization representing low-income individuals, and one of whom shall represent a 8 9 LIHEAP consumer. 10 (2) Three (3) Four (4) members appointed by the senate president, one of whom shall 11 represent the interests of residential ratepayers; one of whom shall represent a chamber of 12 commerce; and one of whom shall represent a non-profit energy consortium of businesses, and

(3) Three (3) members appointed by the governor, one of whom shall represent the LIHEAP program administration; one of whom shall represent the interests of small business owners; and one of whom shall represent the interests of residents of affordable housing.

one of whom shall represent a community action agency LIHEAP program provider.

(b) The appointments to the advisory board shall be made as follows: each appointing authority shall appoint one member to serve a term of one year, one member to serve a term of two (2) years, and one member to serve a term of three (3) years. Thereafter, each member

| 1  | appointed to the advisory board shall serve a three (3) year term. The board members are eligible   |
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| 2  | to succeed themselves. A vacancy, other than by expiration of a term, shall be filled in the manner |
| 3  | of the original appointment, but only for the unexpired portion of the term.                        |
| 4  | (c) Five (5) members shall constitute a quorum. A majority vote of the board shall be               |
| 5  | required for all recommendations, advice, and approvals of the board, in accordance with this       |
| 6  | section.  |
| 7  | (d) A board member shall not receive compensation for his or her service on the board               |
| 8  | but may receive reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses, while engaged in the         |
| 9  | performance of official duties of the board.  |
| 10 | (e) The board shall elect annually a chairperson and vice chairperson from among its                |
| 11 | membership.   |
| 12 | (f) The board shall receive staff and administrative support from the division, to organize         |
| 13 | meetings and take and distribute minutes. The division shall also furnish the advisory board a      |
| 14 | suitable location to hold its meetings.   |
| 15 | (g) The board shall meet at least quarterly and at the call of the chairperson or four (4)          |
| 16 | board members. The administrator shall be present for all board meetings to inform the board of     |
| 17 | the actions of the division and to respond to the board's inquiries.                                |
| 18 | (h) The board shall review legislative proposals and comment on existing state laws                 |
| 19 | relating to residential ratepayers.   |
| 20 | (i) The board shall advise the administrator on matters concerning residential ratepayers           |
| 21 | including, but not limited to utility shut-off policies, rate affordability, conservation measures, |
| 22 | consumer education, smart meters and/or restricted use meters, customer service charges,            |
| 23 | legislation pending before the general assembly, and legislative initiatives.                       |
| 24 | (j) The advisory board shall issue an annual report of findings, including                          |
| 25 | recommendations on current or proposed state programs, policies, regulations and laws, to the       |
| 26 | governor and the general assembly.  |

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
