AN ACT

RELATING TO WATERS AND NAVIGATION -- COASTAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL

Introduced By: Representatives Naughton, Shekarchi, Kennedy, and Bennett Date Introduced: February 28, 2013

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 46-23-2 of the General Laws in Chapter 46-23 entitled "Coastal
 Resources Management Council" is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 3 <u>46-23-2. Coastal resources management council created -- Appointment of</u>

4 **<u>members. --</u>** (a) There is hereby created the coastal resources management council.

5 (1) The coastal resources management council shall consist of sixteen (16) eleven (11) 6 members, two (2) of whom shall be members of the house of representatives, at least one of the 7 members shall represent a coastal municipality, appointed by the speaker, two (2) of whom shall 8 be members of the senate, each of whom shall represent a coastal municipality, appointed by the 9 president of the senate, two (2) of whom shall be from the general public appointed by the 10 speaker of the house for a term of two (2) years, two (2) of whom shall be from a coastal 11 municipality appointed by the speaker of the house for a term of three (3) years.

(2) In addition, four (4) six (6) of the members shall be appointed or elected officials of
local government appointed by the governor, one three (3) of whom shall be from a municipality
of less than twenty-five thousand (25,000) population, appointed to serve until January 31, 1972,
one three (3) of whom shall be from a coastal municipality of more than twenty-five thousand
(25,000) population, appointed to serve until January 31, 1973, and one of whom shall be from a
coastal municipality of less than twenty five thousand (25,000) population appointed to serve
until January 31, 1974, and one of whom shall be from a coastal community of more than twenty-

1 five thousand (25,000) population appointed to serve until January 31, 1975, the The populations 2 are to be determined by the latest federal census; ; all members shall serve until their successors 3 are appointed and qualified; during the month of January, the governor shall appoint a member to 4 succeed the member whose term will then next expire for a term of four (4) years commencing on 5 the first day of February then next following and until his or her successor is named and qualified; each Each municipal appointment shall cease if the appointed or elected official shall 6 7 no longer hold or change the office which he or she held upon appointment, and further, each 8 appointee shall be eligible to succeed himself or herself. All municipal appointments must receive 9 the advice and consent of the senate.

10 (3) Three (3) Five (5) members shall be appointed by the governor from the public, with 11 the advice and consent of the senate, one of whom shall serve until January 1, 1972, one of 12 whom shall serve until January 1, 1973 and one of whom shall serve until January 1, 1974; the 13 <u>The</u> members and their successors shall represent a coastal community.

14 (4) All members shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified; during the 15 month of January, the governor shall appoint, with the advice and consent of the senate, a 16 member to succeed the members whose term will then next expire for a term of three (3) years 17 commencing on the first day of February next following and until his or her successor is named 18 and qualified. A member shall be eligible to succeed himself or herself. No more than two (2) 19 persons on the council shall be from the same community.

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(5) Appointments shall first be made by the governor, then by the president of the senate, 21 and then by the speaker. The commissioner director of the environmental protection branch or his 22 or her designee within the department of environmental management shall serve ex officio. The 23 ex-officio member shall not be counted as serving from any particular community.

24 (b) In addition to the foregoing voting members, the council shall include a varying 25 number of other members who shall serve in an advisory capacity without the right to vote and who shall be invited to serve by either the governor or the voting members. These advisory 26 27 members shall represent the federal agencies such as the navy, coast guard, corps of engineers, 28 public health service, and the federal water pollution control administration, and such regional 29 agencies as the New England river basins commission and the New England regional commission 30 and any other group or interest not otherwise represented.

31 (c) There shall be established a coastal resources advisory committee which committee, 32 appointed by the executive director of the coastal resources management council, shall include, 33 but not be limited to, representation from the following groups: one of whom shall be a representative of the University of Rhode Island Graduate School of Oceanography and the 34

1 College of Resources Development, one of whom shall be a representative of the Sea Grant 2 National College Program, one of whom shall be a representative of the army corps of engineers, 3 one of whom shall be a representative of the federal environmental protection agency's 4 Narragansett Bay laboratory, one of whom shall be a representative of the coastal resources 5 management council, one of whom shall be the director of the department of environmental management; one of whom shall be a member of the Rhode Island Marine Trade Association and 6 7 one of whom shall be a representative of a regional environmental group. The council shall have 8 the authority to appoint such additional members to said advisory committee as is deemed 9 necessary or advisable by the advisory committee or the council. It shall be the responsibility of 10 the committee to advise the coastal resources management council on environmental issues 11 relating to dredging and permitting related thereto, including, but not limited to, those issues 12 defined in sections 46-23-18.1 -- 46-23-18.3, inclusive.

13 (d) The council shall have the authority to form committees of other advisory groups as14 needed from both its own members and others.

SECTION 2. Section 46-23-4 of the General Laws in Chapter 46-23 entitled "Coastal
Resources Management Council" is hereby amended to read as follows:

17 <u>46-23-4. Officers of the council -- Quorum and vote required for action. --</u> The 18 governor, upon the appointment of the appointed members of the council, shall select from the 19 appointed members a chairperson and vice chairperson. The council shall thereupon select a 20 secretary from among its membership or staff. The council may engage such staff, including legal 21 counsel, as it deems necessary. A quorum shall consist of seven (7) six (6) members of the 22 council. A majority vote of those present shall be required for action.

23 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.
