# RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT - ECONOMIC POLICY ADVISORY COMMISSION (EPAC)

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Title 42 of the General Laws entitled "STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following chapter:

CHAPTER 155

ECONOMIC POLICY ADVISORY COMMISSION (EPAC)

<u>42-155-1. Establishment of commission.</u> There is established within the executive department a permanent commission to be known as the "Governor's Advisory Commission on Economic Policy", hereinafter referred to as "the commission".

42-155-2. Composition of commission. — The commission shall be composed of a minimum of seven (7) members, and a maximum of twelve (12) members the governor may appoint. The commission shall consist of at least ten (10) nationally-recognized leaders with specific expertise, with one representative each from the fields of transportation, housing, education, tourism, taxation, workforce development, energy, and healthcare. Two (2) additional members may be appointed by the governor without respect to their residency or area of expertise. Members will serve at the pleasure of the governor. Initial appointments of one year will be made to one-third of the members, two (2) year appointments made to a second one-third of the members, and the final one-third of the members will be appointed to a term of three (3) years. All terms made subsequent to the first year will be for three (3) year terms. Members whose terms are expiring may be appointed to a subsequent term but no member shall serve on

1	the commission a total of more than six (6) years or three (3) full terms of whatever duration.
2	42-155-3. Goals of commission. – The goals of the commission shall be: (1) To provide
3	the governor and the secretary of economic development with independent counsel and advice
4	regarding issues within their individual areas of expertise, and collectively on economic
5	development matters.
6	(2) To assist the office of economic development and its staff with the development of a
7	measurement regime to establish a baseline and track performance on specific economic
8	development goals and objectives, and annually to report publicly on the state's economic
9	performance.
10	(3) To identify and recommend elimination of systemic barriers limiting economic
11	growth and business development.
12	42-155-4. Leadership. – The governor shall serve as chairman of the commission. The
13	commission shall elect from its own membership a vice chairperson, who shall serve until his or
14	her successor is elected, and who is authorized to act as chairperson pro tempore of the
15	commission. The commission shall appoint an executive secretary who shall be a full-time
16	employee of the office of economic development to serve the commission as required. The office
17	of economic development will provide staff, as required, to the commission.
18	42-155-5. Meetings. – The commission shall meet at least twice annually, at a time and
19	place designated by the governor. At least one of its annual meetings will be held in Rhode
20	<u>Island.</u>
21	42-155-6. Compensation and expenses. – The members of the commission shall each be
22	compensated at the rate of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) per year, and will, at the discretion
23	of the governor, be reimbursed the actual cost of their travel and other expense associated with
24	their attendance at meetings and as incurred in the performance of their official duties.
25	Appointees shall receive no additional compensation or benefits.
26	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
