RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES AND CARRIERS -- THE ENERGY REFORM ACT OF 2013

Introduced By: Representatives Handy, and Ruggiero

Date Introduced: April 24, 2013

Referred To: House Environment and Natural Resources

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 42-11-10 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-11 entitled

"Department of Administration" is hereby amended to read as follows:

42-11-10. Statewide planning program. -- (a) Findings. - The general assembly finds that the people of this state have a fundamental interest in the orderly development of the state; the state has a positive interest and demonstrated need for establishment of a comprehensive strategic state planning process and the preparation, maintenance, and implementation of plans for the physical, economic, and social development of the state; the continued growth and development of the state presents problems that cannot be met by the cities and towns individually and that require effective planning by the state; and state and local plans and programs must be properly coordinated with the planning requirements and programs of the federal government.

- (b) Establishment of statewide planning program.
- (1) A statewide planning program is hereby established to prepare, adopt, and amend strategic plans for the physical, economic, and social development of the state and to recommend these to the governor, the general assembly, and all others concerned.
- (2) All strategic planning, as defined in subsection (c) of this section, undertaken by all departments and agencies of the executive branch unless specifically exempted, shall be conducted by or under the supervision of the statewide planning program. The statewide planning

- 1 program shall consist of a state planning council, and the division of planning, which shall be a division within the department of administration.
- 3 (c) Strategic planning. - Strategic planning includes the following activities:
- 4 (1) Establishing or identifying general goals.

- (2) Refining or detailing these goals and identifying relationships between them.
- (3) Formulating, testing, and selecting policies and standards that will achieve desired 7 objectives.
- 8 (4) Preparing long-range or system plans or comprehensive programs that carry out the 9 policies and set time schedules, performance measures, and targets.
 - (5) Preparing functional short-range plans or programs that are consistent with established or desired goals, objectives, and policies, and with long-range or system plans or comprehensive programs where applicable, and that establish measurable intermediate steps toward their accomplishment of the goals, objectives, policies, and/or long-range system plans.
 - (6) Monitoring the planning of specific projects and designing of specific programs of short duration by the operating departments, other agencies of the executive branch, and political subdivisions of the state to insure that these are consistent with and carry out the intent of applicable strategic plans.
 - (7) Reviewing the execution of strategic plans and the results obtained and making revisions necessary to achieve established goals.
 - (d) State guide plan. Components of strategic plans prepared and adopted in accordance with this section may be designated as elements of the state guide plan. The state guide plan shall be comprised of functional elements or plans dealing with land use; physical development and environmental concerns; economic development; housing production; energy supply, including diversification of Rhode Island's energy portfolio through regional and international procurement opportunities of renewable large-scale hydropower and the development of renewable energy resources in Rhode Island, and energy access, use, and conservation; human services; and other factors necessary to accomplish the objective of this section. The state guide plan shall be a means for centralizing, integrating, and monitoring long-range goals, policies, plans, and implementation activities related thereto. State agencies concerned with specific subject areas, local governments, and the public shall participate in the state guide planning process, which shall be closely coordinated with the budgeting process.
- 32 (e) Membership of state planning council. - The state planning council shall consist of:
- 33 (1) The director of the department of administration as chairperson;
- 34 (2) The director, policy office, in the office of the governor, as vice-chairperson;

1	(3) The governor, or his or her designee,
2	(4) The budget officer;
3	(5) The chairperson of the housing resources commission;
4	(6) The highest-ranking administrative officer of the division of planning, as secretary;
5	(7) The president of the League of Cities and Towns or his or her designee and one
6	official of local government, who shall be appointed by the governor from a list of not less than
7	three (3) submitted by the Rhode Island League Cities and Towns;
8	(8) The executive director of the League of Cities and Towns;
9	(9) One representative of a nonprofit community development or housing organization
10	appointed by the governor;
11	(10) Four (4) public members, appointed by the governor;
12	(11) Two (2) representatives of a private, nonprofit environmental advocacy
13	organization, both to be appointed by the governor;
14	(12) The director of planning and development for the city of Providence;
15	(13) The director of the department of transportation;
16	(14) The director of the department of environmental management;
17	(15) The director of the department of health; and
18	(16) The executive director of the economic development corporation.
19	(f) Powers and duties of state planning council The state planning council shall have
20	the following powers and duties:
21	(1) To adopt strategic plans as defined in this section and the long-range state guide plan,
22	and to modify and amend any of these, following the procedures for notification and public
23	hearing set forth in section 42-35-3, and to recommend and encourage implementation of these
24	goals to the general assembly, state and federal agencies, and other public and private bodies;
25	approval of strategic plans by the governor; and to ensure that strategic plans and the long-range
26	state guide plan are consistent with the findings, intent, and goals set forth in section 45-22.2-3,
27	the "Rhode Island Comprehensive Planning and Land Use Regulation Act";
28	(2) To coordinate the planning and development activities of all state agencies, in
29	accordance with strategic plans prepared and adopted as provided for by this section;
30	(3) To review and comment on the proposed annual work program of the statewide
31	planning program;
32	(4) To adopt rules and standards and issue orders concerning any matters within its
33	jurisdiction as established by this section and amendments to it;
34	(5) To establish advisory committees and appoint members thereto representing diverse

- interests and viewpoints as required in the state planning process and in the preparation or implementation of strategic plans. The state planning council shall appoint a permanent committee comprised of:
- (i) Public members from different geographic areas of the state representing diverse interests, and
 - (ii) Officials of state, local and federal government, which shall review all proposed elements of the state guide plan, or amendment or repeal of any element of the plan, and shall advise the state planning council thereon before the council acts on any such proposal. This committee shall also advise the state planning council on any other matter referred to it by the council; and
 - (6) To establish and appoint members to an executive committee consisting of major participants of a Rhode Island geographic information system with oversight responsibility for its activities.
 - (7) To adopt, amend and maintain as an element of the state guide plan or as an amendment to an existing element of the state guide plan, standards and guidelines for the location of eligible renewable energy resources and renewable energy facilities in Rhode Island with due consideration for the location of such resources and facilities in commercial and industrial areas, agricultural areas, areas occupied by public and private institutions, and property of the state and its agencies and corporations, provided such areas are of sufficient size, and in other areas of the state as appropriate.
 - (g) Division of planning.

- (1) The division of planning shall be the principal staff agency of the state planning council for preparing and/or coordinating strategic plans for the comprehensive management of the state's human, economic, and physical resources. The division of planning shall recommend to the state planning council specific guidelines, standards, and programs to be adopted to implement strategic planning and the state guide plan and shall undertake any other duties established by this section and amendments thereto.
- (2) The division of planning shall maintain records (which shall consist of files of complete copies) of all plans, recommendations, rules, and modifications or amendments thereto adopted or issued by the state planning council under this section. The records shall be open to the public.
- (3) The division of planning shall manage and administer the Rhode Island geographic information system of land-related resources, and shall coordinate these efforts with other state departments and agencies, including the University of Rhode Island, which shall provide

- technical support and assistance in the development and maintenance of the system and its associated data base.

 (4) The division of planning shall coordinate and oversee the provision of technical assistance to political subdivisions of the state in preparing and implementing plans to accomplish
- the purposes, goals, objectives, policies, and/or standards of applicable elements of the state guide
 plan and shall make available to cities and towns data and guidelines that may be used in
 preparing comprehensive plans and elements thereof and in evaluating comprehensive plans and

- 10 (i) The division of planning shall be the principal staff agency of the water resources 11 board established pursuant to chapter 46-15 ("Water Resources Board") and the water resources 12 board corporate established pursuant to chapter 46-15.1 ("Water Supply Facilities").
- SECTION 2. Section 42-140-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-140 entitled "Rhode Island Energy Resources Act" is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 15 <u>42-140-3. Purposes. --</u> The purposes of the office shall be to:
 - (1) Develop and put into effect plans and programs to promote, encourage, and assist the provision of energy resources for Rhode Island in a manner that enhances economic well-being, social equity, and environmental quality;
 - (2) Monitor, forecast, and report on energy use, energy prices, and energy demand and supply forecasts, and make findings and recommendations with regard to energy supply diversity, reliability, and procurement, including least-cost procurement;
 - (3) Develop and to put into effect plans and programs to promote, encourage and assist the efficient and productive use of energy resources in Rhode Island, and to coordinate energy programs for natural gas, electricity, and heating oil to maximize the aggregate benefits of conservation and efficiency of investments;
 - (4) Monitor and report technological developments that may result in new and/or improved sources of energy supply, increased energy efficiency, and reduced environmental impacts from energy supply, transmission and distribution;
 - (5) Administer the programs, duties, and responsibilities heretofore exercised by the state energy office, except as these may be assigned by executive order or the general laws to other departments and agencies of state government;
- 32 (6) Develop, recommend and, as appropriate, implement integrated and/or 33 comprehensive strategies, including at regional and federal levels, to secure Rhode Island's 34 interest in energy resources, their supply and efficient use, and as necessary to interact with

4	political subdivisions of the state in achieving its purposes;

14	existing renewable large-scale hydropower facility greater than thirty megawatt (30 MW).

deem necessary, shall prepare and issue by October 15, 2013 a renewable large-scale hydropower opportunities report which shall identify opportunities to procure electricity from a new or existing renewable large-scale hydropower facility greater than thirty megawatt (30 MW), including regional and Rhode Island based procurement opportunities and mechanisms, environmental and greenhouse gas emissions impact, pricing, necessary transmission upgrades and construction completion, resulting transmission and distribution costs, and a timeline for renewable large-scale hydropower to be available for Rhode Island purchase. The electric distribution company shall provide the commissioner with the necessary and requested information to complete the hydroelectric power opportunities report. With respect to the costs associated with the provision of the necessary and requested information by the office, the electric distribution company shall recover said costs in rates by the electric distribution company in the year incurred or the year following incurrence through an appropriate filing with the division of public utilities. The commissioner and the distribution company may also utilize regional analyses as necessary.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.
