SENATE RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING PROFOUND SYMPATHY ON THE PASSING OF FRANK DIPAOLO, JR.

| 1 | WHEREAS, On Thursday, February 14, 2013, the State of Rhode Island lost one of its |

| 2 | greatest treasures with the passing of Frank DiPaolo, Jr.; and |
| 3 | WHEREAS, Mr. DiPaolo, who was 106 years old, devoted his life to steadfastly |
| 4 | supporting the American dream and to tirelessly working to make a better life for generations of |
| 5 | Rhode Islanders. For the last three decades, he was a much-loved inhabitant of the State House. |
| 6 | Much more than his title of doorkeeper conveyed, Frank generously shared his wisdom, his |
| 7 | unqualified friendship, and his sharp sense of humor with legions of members of the Rhode Island |
| 8 | General Assembly; and |
| 9 | WHEREAS, Frank was married to the late Eugenia DiPaolo, and together, they raised |
| 10 | Evelyn, Thomas, Claire Birkmaier, who recently retired from the Rhode Island State Senate, and |
| 11 | the late Richard. He was also blessed with fifteen grandchildren, seventeen great-grandchildren |
| 12 | and a newly arrived great-great granddaughter and was the brother of Clara and the late Etta, |
| 13 | Philip, and Anthony; and |
| 14 | WHEREAS, Frank's life was replete with a wealth of experiences and a significant array |
| 15 | of relationships. In his youth, he passionately pursued bicycle racing. He was also an assistant to |
| 16 | Dr. Thomas F. Scanlon for many years, and built a friendship with the doctor that was based on |
| 17 | mutual respect and a shared love of hunting and fishing; and |
| 18 | WHEREAS, Frank displayed considerable talent as a mechanic and maintained a small |
| 19 | fleet of flower cars. While he considered it a thrill to travel to Indianapolis to watch the Indy 500, |
| 20 | in his heart, no other vehicle ever came close to his 1926 Packard touring cars; and |

| 1 | WHEREAS, For many years, Frank and his brother, Philip, were the owners of the Castle |

| 2 | Spa on Chalkstone Avenue, a must visit destination that earned its reputation for having the best |
| 3 | ham sandwiches in the state; and |
| 4 | WHEREAS, Frank's adult life was marked by energy and enthusiasm for local, state, and |
| 5 | national politics. He consistently supported those political candidates he thought could change the |
| 6 | world for the better. In 1928, he backed New York Governor Alfred Smith in the Governor's |
| 7 | unsuccessful run for President. Frank went on to help fuel the campaigns of fifteen Rhode Island |
| 8 | governors and over thirty General Assembly races; and |
| 9 | WHEREAS, Frank played an especially prominent role in supporting former |
| 10 | Congressman Patrick Kennedy, when the Congressman was still a student at Providence College |
| 11 | and Castle Spa customer who dreamed of becoming a statesman. Frank saw the budding |
| 12 | leadership in young Patrick and provided him with seasoned advice and encouragement that won |
| 13 | him a seat in the Rhode Island House of Representatives and paved the way to a successful bid |
| 14 | for Congress. Congressman Kennedy counted Frank as one of his must trusted advisors and |
| 15 | friends, and Frank, in turn, considered Congressman Kennedy as his "number three son"; and |
| 16 | WHEREAS, At the age of 99, Frank attended a White House dinner and met the |
| 17 | President, but he was most proud of having a private audience at the Vatican with Pope John Paul |
| 18 | II; and |
| 19 | WHEREAS, Frank DiPaolo achieved an extraordinary impact over the course of his |
| 20 | lifetime, through his actions and through the actions he inspired in others. A man of immense |
| 21 | conviction, he never wavered in his support of what he thought was right and good; now, |
| 22 | therefore be it |
| 23 | RESOLVED, That this Senate of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations |
| 24 | hereby expresses its profound sympathy on the passing of Frank DiPaolo, Jr.; and be if further |
| 25 | RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and hereby is authorized and directed to |
| 26 | transmit duly certified copies of this resolution to the DiPaolo Family, Claire Birkmaier and The |
| 27 | Honorable Patrick Kennedy. |
