RECOGNIZING AND COMMENDING SEAN FAY-WOLFE ON ACHIEVING SCOUTING'S MOST DISTINGUISHED HONOR, THE RANK OF EAGLE SCOUT

1 WHEREAS, The Boy Scouts of America has a long and impressive history of preparing 2 young men to assume responsibility in their communities. Sean Fay-Wolfe is such an 3 extraordinary young man and his accomplishments as a Boy Scout are truly worthy and deserving 4 of our recognition and praise; and WHEREAS, Not every boy, nor even every Scout, qualifies for the high rank of Eagle. 5 6 Strenuous physical hurdles, high mental requirements, strong personal character, indomitable 7 spirit, and a commitment to community service are a rare combination of qualities and 8 achievements to find in one person; and 9 WHEREAS, Sean has distinguished himself through his continued performance of service in Scouting. He has demonstrated exemplary leadership abilities and has exhibited a 10 11 strong sense of duty, honor, and patriotism, making him a clear example of the best qualities of 12 American youth; and 13 WHEREAS, Sean, a member of Troop 1, Kingston, Rhode Island, has held several leadership positions, including Librarian, Instructor, Troop Guide, and Historian. As the 14 15 Historian, he devoted countless hours and an amazing amount of energy developing the Historian 16 website. He has demonstrated wide-ranging abilities, effective skills, and the kind of self confidence that makes him a worthy leader; and 17

WHEREAS, Learning important lifelong skills and values, Sean earned fifty merit

badges. Sean also earned several special awards, such as the Abnaki Lodge, Order of the Arrow,

1	which is Scouting's honor society, and two Roman Catholic Boy Scouts awards, the Ad Altri Dei
2	award and the Pope Pius XII award; and
3	WHEREAS, Sean has completed the arduous and demanding requirements necessary to
4	be awarded the rank of Eagle Scout. As the highlight of his scouting years and to complete the
5	final step toward obtaining the rank of Eagle, Sean planned, developed, and carried out an
6	extensive Eagle Scout service project. His Eagle Project was to construct and install shades on the
7	top of the outdoor dog kennels and outdoor exercise/play area at the South Kingstown Animal
8	Shelter; and
9	WHEREAS, Sean is the son of Dr. Victor Fay-Wolfe and Kelli Fay-Wolfe, and is
10	currently in his Sophomore year at South Kingstown High School, where he is a four-time All
11	State Violist and a member of the Science and Mathematics Initiative for Learning Enhancement.
12	Sean has been a committed volunteer Den Chief for the Cub Scouts Pack 6 in West Kingston and
13	is a 2nd Degree Black Belt in Shorin Ryu Shidokan; and
14	WHEREAS, It is essential and fitting to recognize the triumphs of our youth and to
15	celebrate the accomplishments of our future leaders. Sean Fay-Wolfe is a remarkable young man
16	who exemplifies everything an Eagle Scout should be, and all that we hope our children will
17	grow to be; now, therefore be it
18	RESOLVED, That this Senate of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations
19	hereby honors Sean Fay-Wolfe for his service to the community and for setting a high standard of
20	commitment and dedication by which youth of this great state may follow. We congratulate him
21	for all he has done to attain the rank of Eagle, and extend our very best wishes for good health
22	and happiness in the months and years ahead; and be it further
