#### RELATING TO CRIMINAL OFFENSES -- TRESPASS AND VANDALISM

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 11-44-21.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 11-44 entitled "Trespass
and Vandalism" is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### 3 11-44-21.1. Graffiti -- Defacing private residences, offices, businesses or commercial property. -- (a)(1) Every person who shall willfully, maliciously or mischievously write upon, 4 5 paint, or otherwise deface the private property or residence of another, any office building, business or commercial property or public building or public property, shall be guilty of a 6 7 misdemeanor-, For for the first and second offense, said penalty shall not exceed a five hundred dollar (\$500) one thousand dollars (\$1,000) fine and community service not exceeding one 8 9 hundred (100) two hundred (200) hours. Every person convicted of a second third or subsequent 10 offense under this section shall be guilty of a felony, subject to imprisonment not exceeding two 11 (2) years, a fine of fined up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) two thousand dollars (\$2,000), and 12 shall be required to perform up to two hundred (200) three hundred (300) hours of community 13 service. The court, upon conviction or adjudication, shall order restitution to the victim in the 14 amount of removal, repair, or replacement costs. 15 (2) If the graffiti is positioned on an overpass or an underpass and requires that traffic be interfered with in order to remove it, or the entity responsible for the area in which the clean-up is 16 17 to take place must provide assistance in order for the removal to take place safely, the court shall 18 order an additional assessment of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

19 (b) If the person is a minor, upon adjudication, in addition to the penalties in subsection

| 6  | (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, the family court may order the               |
| 7  | parent or legal guardian of any minor found to have committed the crime of graffiti, to submit        |
| 8  | restitution to the victim or victims of such graffiti by payment in money if the minor is in the      |
| 9  | custody of and residing with such parent or guardian, and if the family court finds, after hearing,   |
| 10 | that the graffiti was a direct result of the parent or legal guardian having neglected to exercise    |
| 11 | reasonable supervision and control of the minor's conduct. For the purposes of this section,          |
| 12 | liability for compensation shall be limited to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).                       |
| 13 | (3) If the person violates the family court's order to submit restitution under this section,         |
| 14 | such person shall be guilty of contempt. The court may permit payments under this section to be       |
| 15 | made in installments, for a period of up to seven (7) years, to be administered by the court.         |
| 16 | SECTION 2. Chapter 11-44 of the General Laws entitled "Trespass and Vandalism" is                     |
| 17 | hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:   |
| 18 | 11-44-21.2. Restitution or removal of graffiti Rescission of order suspending or                      |
| 19 | invalidating operator's license or learner's permit If a court of suitable jurisdiction has           |
| 20 | entered an order for suspension or invalidation of a minor's operator's license or a learner's permit |
| 21 | pursuant to section 11-44-21.1, and if the same court subsequently determines that the minor has      |
| 22 | fulfilled his or her restitution obligation, the court may:   |
| 23 | (1) Rescind the order for suspension or invalidation; and/or  |
| 24 | (2) Allow the minor to receive a license or permit before the period of suspension or                 |
| 25 | invalidation ends.  |
| 26 | SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.   |
