RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT - LONG-TERM ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT VISION AND POLICY

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Title 42 of the General Laws entitled "STATE AFFAIRS AND
2	GOVERNMENT" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following chapter:
3	<u>CHAPTER 64.15</u>
4	LONG-TERM ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
5	42-64.15-1. Long-term Economic Development Vision and Policy (a) No later than
6	October 31, 2013 the Economic Development Corporation and the Division of Planning shall
7	develop a written long-term economic development vision and policy for the state of Rhode
8	Island and a strategic plan for implementing the policy. Such a plan shall include, but not be
9	limited to:
10	(1) a unified economic development strategy for the state that integrates business growth
11	with land use and transportation choices;
12	(2) an analysis of how the state's infrastructure can best support this unified economic
13	development strategy;
14	(3) a focus and prioritization that the outcomes of the economic development strategy be
15	equitable for all Rhode Islanders;
16	(4) reliance on comprehensive economic data and analysis relating to Rhode Island's
17	economic competitiveness, business climate, national and regional reputation, and present
18	economic development resources;

1 (5) suggestions for improving and expanding the skills, abilities, and resources of state

2 agencies, municipalities, and community partners to speed implementation of the plans'

3 <u>recommendations; and</u>

- 4 (6) the inclusion of detailed implementation plans, including stated goals, specific
 5 performance measures and indicators.
- (b) On or before October 31, 2014, the Economic Development Corporation and the
 Division of Planning shall submit the written long-term economic development vision and policy
- 8 and implementation plan to the Governor, the Senate and the House of Representatives.

9 (c) Beginning January 1, 2015, and during the first year of each new or re-elected 10 gubernatorial administration thereafter, the governor shall convene an economic development 11 planning council consisting of no fewer than nineteen (19) members: one of whom shall be the 12 director of the economic development corporation, who shall serve as chair; one of whom shall be 13 the director of the department of administration, one of whom shall be the director of revenue; 14 one of whom shall be the director of the department of labor and training; one of whom shall be 15 the director of the department of environmental management; one of whom shall be the director 16 of the department of transportation; one of whom shall be the director of the department of 17 business regulation; one of whom shall be the commissioner of elementary and secondary 18 education; one of whom shall be appointed by speaker of the house of representatives; one of 19 whom shall be appointed by the president of the senate; and nine of whom shall be appointed by 20 the governor: one of whom shall be the president of the University of Rhode Island, or the 21 president of Rhode Island College, or the president of the Community College of Rhode Island, 22 one of whom shall be a representative from the league of cities and towns, two of whom shall be a representative from a chamber of commerce, one of whom shall be from a non-profit 23 24 organization representing a major industry sector in Rhode Island, one of whom shall represent a business with more than one hundred employees located in Rhode Island, one of whom shall 25 26 represent a business with fewer than one hundred employees located in Rhode Island, one of 27 whom shall be from a venture capital firm with a principal place of business in the Rhode Island, 28 and one of whom shall represent a private sector labor union. Any department director appointed 29 as a member of the council may appoint a designee from his or her respective agency to represent 30 him/her on the council. Members of the council shall serve for a term of one year or until an 31 economic development policy has been approved by the governor under this section. 32 (d) The economic development planning council shall develop a written long-term

33 economic development vision and policy for the state and a strategic plan for implementing the

34 policy. In developing the policy, the council shall review and consider the published economic

1 development policy and implementation plan in effect at the commencement of the governor's 2 term of office. The policy shall set long term goals and measurable benchmarks which are not 3 limited to a particular gubernatorial administration and shall give consideration to any impacts the 4 plan may have on businesses employing ten (10) or fewer people. The strategic plan shall include 5 any major economic development initiatives and programs in effect at the time of the plan's creation. In developing the policy the council may hold public hearings throughout the state. 6 7 (e) Once the policy and plan have been approved and adopted by the council, the council 8 shall submit the policy and plan to the senate and house of representatives. The approved policy 9 and plan shall be published in writing and on the official website of the state no later than 10 December 31 of that year. 11 (f) The Economic Development Corporation shall be responsible for staffing the work of 12 the Council and the division of planning shall also provide staff support. All departments 13 represented on the council shall cooperate with the economic development corporation and the 14 division of planning to facilitate the purposes of this chapter. 15 (g) Subject to funding, the Council shall be able to hire consultants and related assistance 16 to provide the type of analysis necessary to inform their work. 17 (h) All departments, offices, boards and agencies of the state shall cooperate with the 18 economic development planning council and furnish such administrative and staff support, 19 advice, information, documentary and otherwise, data and data analysis and other support as may 20 be necessary or desirable. 21 (i) In carrying out the responsibility under this order, the Council may: (1) accept grant 22 funds and in-kind contributions from governmental and private entities; (2) hold hearings; (3) 23 invite experts and other witnesses to submit testimony; and (4) contract with experts and 24 consultants as necessary to inform deliberations and recommendations. 25 (j) In addition to any other applicable law, rules or regulations, the economic 26 development planning council shall be subject to the provisions of the Open Meetings Act, Title 27 42, Chapter 46 of the Rhode Island General Laws and the Public Records Act, Title 38, Chapter 2 28 of the Rhode Island General Laws. 29 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

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RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT - LONG-TERM ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT VISION AND POLICY

1	This act would establish a nineteen (19) member economic development planning council
2	to develop a written long-term economic development vision and policy and strategic
3	implementation plan. This act would also direct the economic development corporation and the
4	division of planning to develop the initial written long-term economic development vision and
5	policy and strategic implementation plan for submission to the governor, senate and house of
6	representatives on or before October 31, 2014.
7	This act would take effect upon passage.

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
