



1 Island, or his or her designee;

2 (6) One of whom shall be the president of the Rhode Island association of fire fighters, or  
3 his or her designee;

4 (7) One of whom shall be the president of the Rhode Island chapter of the associated  
5 general contractors, or his or her designee;

6 (8) One of whom shall be the president of the housing network or his or her designee;

7 (9) Two (2) of whom shall be appointed by the director of the department of labor and  
8 training, one with an expertise in elevator safety rules and regulations and one with an expertise  
9 in boiler safety rules and regulations;

10 (10) Two (2) of whom shall be appointed by the League of Cities and Towns, one from a  
11 city and one from a town to represent the interests of municipalities that administer building code  
12 issues;

13 (11) One of whom shall be the chairperson of the Rhode Island historical preservation  
14 and heritage commission, or his or her designee;

15 (12) One of whom shall be the President of the Rhode Island builders' association or his  
16 or her designee;

17 (13) One of whom shall be an environmental engineer, to be appointed by the governor;  
18 and

19 (14) One of whom shall be an attorney whose practice is concentrated in building and  
20 construction, to be appointed by the governor.

21 (b) Forthwith upon the effective date of this chapter, the members of the council shall  
22 meet at the call of the chairs and organize. Vacancies in the council shall be filled in like manner  
23 as the original appointment.

24 (c) The department of public safety is hereby directed to provide suitable quarters for the  
25 council.

26 (d) All departments and agencies of the state shall furnish such advice and information  
27 documentary and otherwise to the commission and its agents as is deemed necessary or desirable  
28 by the commission to facilitate the purposes of this chapter.

29 **23-88-3. Meeting and reporting requirements.** – The council shall meet regularly and  
30 present and report its findings and recommendations to the President of the Senate and the  
31 Speaker of the House by March 31, 2014. The council shall cease to exist on July 1, 2015.

32 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
