Until the age of 104, she was still cleaning her own house and her family will always 14 consider her macaroni and gravy and homemade soup to be the best in the state; and 15 WHEREAS, As a resident of Golden Crest Nursing Centre in North Providence, Mrs. 16 Cardullo no longer has to worry about doing the cooking and cleaning, but she likes to keep herself active and her mind sharp by playing games like bridge and Scrabble; and 17 18 WHEREAS, Filled with a wisdom that can only be gained through life's joys and 19 tribulations, Mrs. Cardullo's philosophy is simple: work hard, eat right, tell the truth, and treat 20 others right; and

WHEREAS, Lillian Cardullo is our state's oldest resident, but more importantly, she is a dear friend to many and the beloved matriarch of her family. She has lived a long, happy, and fulfilled life. In 1903, the year she was born, the average life expectancy in the United States was 47 years old.
