JOINT RESOLUTION

DECLARING AND CONSENTING TO A RECESS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Introduced By: Senators Goodwin, and Bates

Date Introduced: July 03, 2013

Referred To: Recommended for Immediate Consideration

1 RESOLVED, That when both houses of the general assembly adjourn on the legislative
2 day of Wednesday, July 3, 2013, they shall be in recess until the call of the speaker of the house
3 of representatives or of the president of the senate. During the said recess, the desks of both
4 houses shall remain open for the sole purpose of receiving committee reports from committees
5 and/or veto messages from the governor. The desk of the senate shall remain open for the
6 additional purpose of receiving requests for the senate's advice and consent to such nominations,
7 appointments and/or assignments as may be provided by law.

8 Adjournment on the legislative day of Wednesday, July 3, 2013, and any subsequent
9 reconvening prior to Tuesday, January 7, 2014, are hereby accorded the consent of both the house
10 of representatives and of the senate in accordance with section 9 of article VI of the constitution
11 of this state.

12 The house may reconvene at any time prior to Tuesday, January 7, 2014, upon the call of
13 the speaker upon three (3) days' notice, in writing, to each member of the house; for which
14 reconvening and subsequent recess or adjournment the senate gives its consent in accordance
15 with section 9 of article VI of the constitution of the state. Sending notices addressed to the
16 members of the house, at their addresses as the same appear on the records of the general
17 assembly by regular mail postage prepaid, shall be deemed sufficient compliance with the
18 foregoing provisions for notice in writing.

19 The senate may reconvene at any time prior to Tuesday, January 7, 2014, upon the call of
20 the president upon three (3) days' notice, in writing, to each member of the senate; for which

1 reconvening and subsequent recess or adjournment the house of representatives gives its consent
2 in accordance with section 9 of article VI of the constitution of the state. Sending notices
3 addressed to members of the senate, at their addresses as the same appear on the records of the
4 general assembly by regular mail postage prepaid, shall be deemed sufficient compliance with the
5 foregoing provisions for notice in writing.
