RELATING TO LABOR AND LABOR RELATIONS - MINIMUM WAGES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 28-12-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 28-12 entitled "Minimum
2	Wages" is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	28-12-3. Minimum wages (a) Every employer shall pay to each of his or her
4	employees: commencing July 1, 1999, at least the minimum wage of five dollars and sixty five
5	cents (\$5.65) per hour. Commencing September 1, 2000, the minimum wage is six dollars and
6	fifteen cents (\$6.15) per hour.
7	(b) Commencing January 1, 2004, the minimum wage is six dollars and seventy-five
8	cents (\$6.75) per hour.
9	(c) Commencing March 1, 2006, the minimum wage is seven dollars and ten cents
10	(\$7.10) per hour.
11	(d) Commencing January 1, 2007, the minimum wage is seven dollars and forty cents
12	(\$7.40) per hour.
13	(e) Commencing January 1, 2013, the minimum wage is seven dollars and seventy-five
14	cents (\$7.75) per hour.
15	(f) Commencing January 1, 2014, the minimum wage is eight dollars (\$8.00) per hour.
16	(g) Commencing January 1, 2015, the minimum wage is nine dollars (\$9.00) per hour.
17	(h) Commencing January 1, 2016, the minimum wage is ten dollars (\$10.00) per hour.
18	(i) Commencing January 1, 2017, and on January 1 of each year thereafter, the

department of labor and training shall calculate an adjusted minimum wage rate to maintain

- 1 employee purchasing power by increasing the current year's minimum wage rate by the rate of
- 2 inflation. The adjusted minimum wage rate shall be calculated to the nearest cent using the
- 3 consumer price index for urban wage earners and clerical workers, CPI-W, or a successor index,
- 4 for the previous year as calculated for the northeast region by the United States Department of
- 5 <u>Labor.</u>
- 6 (j) Under no circumstances shall the state's minimum wage be less than fifteen cents
- 7 (\$.15) more than the federal minimum wage.
- 8 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

RELATING TO LABOR AND LABOR RELATIONS - MINIMUM WAGES

- 1 This act would gradually increase the minimum hourly wage every year until January 1,
- 2 2017 when it would be adjusted using the consumer price index for the northeast region.
- This act would take effect upon passage.
