It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 23-12.7 of the General Laws entitled "The Breast Cancer Act" is

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect on October 1, 2014.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO INSURANCE - HEALTH AND SAFETY - THE BREAST CANCER ACT

1 This act would require that each mammography report given to a patient must include 2 information about the patient's breast density and to advise that under certain circumstances the 3 patient may benefit from a breast ultrasound screening. In addition, most insurance policies shall 4 be required to provide coverage for the ultrasound screening. This act would take effect on October 1, 2014. 5 LC004154
