SECTION 1. Chapter 16-63 of the General Laws entitled "Adult Education [See Title 16

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

2	Chapter 97 - The Rhode Island Board of Education Act]" is hereby amended by adding thereto
3	the following section:
4	16-63-18. High school equivalency testing. – (a) In selecting which tests shall be
5	utilized and recognized by the state in the granting of high school equivalency diplomas, the
6	board shall consider all available high school equivalency tests that meet and adhere to Rhode
7	Island academic standards and shall give priority to those tests that are provided at the lowest cost
8	for test takers. In selecting said tests, the board shall consider:
9	(1) The recognition of the test, or lack thereof, by other states;
10	(2) The portability of the test; and
11	(3) Such other criteria that meet the needs of the test takers.
12	(b) The board shall adopt a rule or regulation granting a waiver of fees associated with
13	the high school equivalency test for individuals with limited income and who can prove a
14	financial hardship; provided, however, that to be eligible for a fee waiver, an individual must
15	have received at least a minimum passing score on the high school equivalency practice test, or
16	pertinent section of the test. The waiver may be based on a sliding scale based on the individual's
17	income.
