As a 6 7 result, applicants for a liquor license must provide proof of coverage under a liquor liability insurance policy for bodily injury or death for a minimum amount of one million dollars 8

SECTION 1. Chapter 3-7 of the General Laws entitled "Retail Licenses" is hereby
