It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Title 23 of the General Laws entitled "HEALTH AND SAFETY" is hereby 2 amended by adding thereto the following chapter: 3 CHAPTER 4.13 4 GOVERNMENT NONINTERFERENCE IN REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH CARE 5 23-4.13-1. Noninterference in reproductive health care. -- (a) Neither the state nor any of its political subdivisions shall interfere with a woman's personal decision to prevent, 6 7 commence, or continue a pregnancy, or to terminate a pregnancy prior to fetal viability; nor shall the state or any of its political subdivisions interfere in the third trimester of the pregnancy if such 8 9 termination is necessary to protect the life or health of the woman. Nor shall the state or any of 10 its political subdivisions restrict the use of medically appropriate methods of contraception or 11 abortion or the manner in which medically appropriate contraception or abortion is provided. 12 (b) For purposes of this section, "fetal viability" means that stage when, in the medical 13 judgment of the attending physician, based on the particular facts of the case before the physician, there is a reasonable likelihood of the fetus' sustained survival outside the womb. 14 15 (c) Nothing contained in this section shall affect the parental consent provisions of § 23-4.7-6; or the exemption for non-participation as afforded under § 23-17-11. 16
