It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 16-12 of the General Laws entitled "Rights and Duties of Teachers
- 2 Generally" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
- 3 <u>16-12-11. Educator evaluations. (a) As to any teacher evaluation system instituted</u>
- 4 pursuant to the department of education's educator evaluation system standards or similar
- 5 <u>methodology, the following provisions shall apply:</u>
- 6 (1) Any teacher who obtains or earns a rating of "highly effective" or a number "4" or any
  7 equivalent thereof shall, subsequent to such evaluation, be evaluated not more than once every
- 8 <u>four (4) years thereafter.</u>
- 9 (2) Any teacher who obtains or earns a rating of "effective" or a number "3" or any
  10 equivalent thereof shall, subsequent to such evaluation, be evaluated not more than once every
  11 three (3) years thereafter.
- 12 (b) Any regulations of the department of education providing for the evaluation of

13 teachers shall be modified to conform with the provisions and schedule set forth herein; provided,

14 however, that nothing herein shall be construed to direct the department of education to act so as

- 15 to jeopardize any current funding from a race to the top grant received by the state.
- 16 (c) The provisions of this section shall apply only to teachers who have at least three (3)

17 <u>full years of successful teaching experience in their respective district. The provisions of this</u>

- 18 section shall not prohibit the annual evaluation of teachers during their first three (3) years in a
- 19 <u>district.</u>

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

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# EXPLANATION

## BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

### RELATING TO EDUCATION

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This act would provide that teachers who obtain a rating of "highly effective" or the 1 2 equivalent thereof would be evaluated not more than once every four (4) years, and that teachers 3 who obtain a rating of "effective" or the equivalent thereof would be evaluated not more than 4 once every three (3) years. This act would not prohibit annual evaluations for teachers during their first three (3) years in a district. 5 6

This act would take effect upon passage.

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
