It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 5-25-14 of the General Laws in Chapter 5-25 entitled "Veterinary 2 Practice" is hereby amended to read as follows: 3 5-25-14. Grounds for refusal to issue, refusal to renew, revoke, or suspend a license. -- The division has the power to deny, revoke or suspend any license issued under this chapter or 4 5 otherwise discipline a licensee upon proof of the following: 6 (1) Conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude; conviction of a felony; and 7 conviction of a crime arising out of the practice of veterinary medicine; 8 (2) Addiction to narcotics, habitual drunkenness, or rendering professional services to a 9 patient while the veterinarian is intoxicated or incapacitated by the use of drugs; 10 (3) Knowingly placing the health of a client at serious risk without maintaining proper 11 precautions; 12 (4) Fraud or misrepresentation in any phase of procuring or renewing a license; 13 (5) Unprofessional conduct, which includes the matters set forth in the section or other 14 matters as further defined in regulations of the division; 15 (6) Advertising designed to mislead the public; (7) Representing certain procedures are performed with greater authority or expertise; 16

(8) Fraud or misrepresentation of treatment procedures or statements regarding the

2	(10) Failure to maintain acceptable sanitation standards;
3	(11) Malpractice, gross negligence, or wanton disregard of accepted professional

5	(12) Adjudication of mental incompetence;
6	(13) Lack of fitness to practice by reason of mental or physical impairment or otherwise;

8	(14) Any other grounds to deny, revoke or suspend a license as provided for in the rules

10	(15) Failure to return an animal to the owner thereof, solely as a consequence of an
11	unpaid bill for treatment.
