It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 40-6.2-1.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 40-6.2 entitled "Child Care-State Subsidies" is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 <u>40-6.2-1.1. Rates established. --</u> (a) Subject to the payment limitations in section (b), the

maximum reimbursement rates to be paid by the departments of human services and children,

youth and families for licensed child care centers and certified family-child care providers shall

be based on the following schedule of the 75th percentile of the 2002 weekly market rates

3	(b) The department shall pay child care providers based on the lesser of the applicab		
4	rate specified in subsection (a), or the lo	west rate actually charged by the provider to any of its	
5	public or private child care customers wit	h respect to each of the rate categories, infant, preschool	
6	and school-age.		
7	(c) By June 30, 2004 and biennia	ally thereafter, the department of labor and training shall	
8	conduct an independent survey or certi-	fy an independent survey of the then current weekly	
9	market rates for child care in Rhode Isla	nd and shall forward such weekly market rate survey to	
10	the department of human services. The de	epartments of human services and labor and training will	
11	jointly determine the survey criteria in	cluding, but not limited to, rate categories and sub-	
12	categories. The 75th percentile of week	ly market rates in the table in subsection (a) shall be	
13	adjusted by the surveys conducted under	this subsection, beginning January 1, 2006 and for the	
14	purposes of this section, and until adjuste	ed in accordance with this subsection, the 75th percentile	
15	of weekly market rate shall be the average	e of the 2002 and 2004 weekly market rate surveys.	
16	(d) In order to expand the ac	cessibility and availability of quality child care, the	
17	department of human services is author	ized to establish by regulation alternative or incentive	
18	rates of reimbursement for quality enl	nancements, innovative or specialized child care and	
19	alternative methodologies of child care of	delivery, including non-traditional delivery systems and	
20	collaborations.		
21	(e) On or before January 1, 2007,	all child care providers have the option to be paid every	
22	two (2) weeks and have the option of aut	comatic direct deposit and/or electronic funds transfer of	
23	reimbursement payments.		
24	(f) On or before October 31, 2013	5, the department shall develop and submit to the general	
25	assembly for approval a plan for license	ed child care centers and family child care providers to	
26	develop a system of tiered reimbursem	ent rates with higher rates being issued to programs	
27	recognized as "higher quality" by the	department's quality rating and improvement system.	
28	Provided further, the plan shall include	specific programs to support quality improvement and	
29	advancement in the department's quality	rating system. Said programs shall include, but not be	
30	limited to, the following:		
31	(1) Comprehensive workforce	development programs to assist licensed child care	
32	providers to pursue high school equival	ency diplomas, associate's degrees, bachelor's degrees,	
33	college credits in early child care and education, and any other program the director shall approve		
34	or deem necessary.		

- 1 (g) The director is directed and authorized to promulgate rules and regulations necessary
- 2 to carry out the provisions of this section.
- 3 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
