CONGRATULATING THE NORTH SMITHFIELD "WE THE PEOPLE" STUDENTS ON WINNING THE 2015 STATEWIDE COMPETITION

WHEREAS, "We the People: The Citizen and the Constitution Competition" is 1 sponsored by the Center for Civic Education and is a yearly competition held in Washington, 2 3 D.C., for American high school students. Teams are divided into six units, each comprised of 4 three or more members, and each team focuses on a particular area of Constitutional interest; and WHEREAS, On February 7th of 2015, thirty-one students from North Smithfield High 5 School, under the expert guidance of their American Government honors class teacher and the 6 7 Social Studies Department chair, Mrs. Natalie O'Brien, competed against students from high schools across the state and won the "We the People" competition. It is the ninth year in a row 8 9 that students representing North Smithfield High School have won the state competition; and 10 WHEREAS, Since the beginning of the school year in September, student team members 11 have been arduously studying the Constitution, its founding principles, and its historic and 12 modern application; and WHEREAS, For the competition, the team must deliver a prepared statement on a 13 specific Constitutional topic and answer a series of questions asked by a panel of judges. Prior to 14 15 the competition, the team prepares for a wide variety of potential follow-up questions, as they are not allowed to use any materials during the competition, and are not forewarned of the questions 16 that will be posed until they are asked. The format of the competition requires students to develop 17 18 the important skills of critical thinking and performing under pressure; and WHEREAS, As a result of their state victory on February 7th, the team will be 19
