## AN ACT

# RELATING TO MOTOR AND OTHER VEHICLES -- OPERATORS' AND CHAUFFEURS' LICENSES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 31-10-6 of the General Laws in Chapter 31-10 entitled "Operators'
and Chauffeurs' Licenses" is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 31-10-6. Graduated licensing for person under the age of eighteen (18). -- (a)

4 Purpose. - To ensure that license holders have sufficient training and experience and to promote

safe, responsible driving, persons under the age of eighteen (18) shall be granted driving

privileges on a limited basis as follows:

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- 7 (1) Level 1 -- Limited instruction permit.
- 8 (2) Level 2 -- Limited provisional license.
- 9 (3) Level 3 -- Full operator's license.

10 (b) Requirements and privileges. - A permit or license issued pursuant to this section
11 must have a color background or border that indicates the level of driving privileges granted by
12 the permit or license.

(1) Limited instruction permit. - Any person who is at least sixteen (16) years of age but less than eighteen (18) years of age may apply to the division of motor vehicles for a limited instruction permit. The division of motor vehicles may, after the applicant has successfully completed a course of driver training prescribed in § 31-10-19 and passed a standardized written examination approved by the administrator of the division of motor vehicles or otherwise complied with the requirements of § 31-10-21, issue to the applicant a limited instruction permit

2	(i) The permit holder must be in possession of the permit;
3	(ii) A supervising driver must be seated beside the permit holder in he the front seat of
4	the vehicle when it is in motion;
5	(iii) No person other than the supervising driver can be in the front seat;
6	(iv) Every person occupying the vehicle being driven by the permit holder must have a
7	safety belt properly fastened about his or her body, or be restrained by a child passenger restrained
8	system as provided in § 31-22-22 when the vehicle is in motion;
9	(v) The permittee shall wear a safety belt at all times unless the permittee provides the
.0	division of motor vehicles with a statement from a physician indicating that for medical reasons
.1	the permittee cannot wear a safety belt. A limited instruction permit shall be valid for a period of
2	one year, and may be extended for a reasonable period of time if the holder of the permit provides
.3	the division of motor vehicles with evidence of a hardship. Any person who is at least sixteen
4	(16) years of age and is enrolled in a commercial drivers' school or in a regularly recognized
.5	secondary school or college driver training program which is approved by the division of motor
6	vehicles shall not be required to have a limited instruction permit while operating a dual-control
.7	training vehicle regularly used by that school in its driver training program and while a regular
.8	instructor in that school or program is occupying the seat beside that person.
9	(2) Limited provisional license A person may obtain a limited provisional license if the
20	person meets all of the following requirements:
21	(i) (A) Has held a limited instruction permit issued by the division of motor vehicles for
22	at least six (6) months;
23	(B) Has not been convicted of a motor vehicle moving violation or seat belt infraction
24	during the preceding six (6) months;
25	(C) Passes a road test administered by the division of motor vehicles and shall also meet
26	the requirements of subsection (iii) herein.
27	(ii) A limited provisional license authorizes the license holder to drive a motor vehicle
28	only under the following conditions:
29	(A) The license holder must be in possession of the license.
80	(B) The license holder may drive without supervision in any of the following
81	circumstances:
32	(I) From 5:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m.;
33	(II) When driving to or from work;
34	(III) When driving to or from an activity of a volunteer fire department, volunteer rescue

which shall entitle the applicant to drive a motor vehicle only under the following conditions:

1	squad or volunteer emergency medical service, if the driver is a member of one of these
2	organizations.
3	(C) The license holder may drive with supervision at any time. When the license holder
4	is driving with supervision, the supervising driver must be seated beside the license holder in the
5	front seat of the vehicle when it is in motion.
6	(D) Every person occupying the vehicle being driven by the license holder must have a
7	safety belt properly fastened about his or her body, or be restrained by a child safety passenger
8	restraint system as provided in § 31-22-22 when the vehicle is in motion.
9	(iii) In addition to meeting the requirements of paragraph (i) of this subdivision, a person
10	under the age of eighteen (18) years seeking to obtain a provisional license shall present with his
11	or her application a statement signed by the person's parent or guardian stating that the applicant
12	has obtained a minimum of fifty (50) hours of experience with ten (10) of those at night as a
13	driver while driving with a supervising driver. These fifty (50) hours may include driving lessons
14	with a commercial driving school or any other supervised driving.
15	(iv) During the first twelve (12) months of a limited provisional license no more than one
16	passenger younger than twenty-one (21) years of age is allowed in the vehicle. Immediate
17	family/household members are excepted from this subsection.
18	(3) Full operator's license (i) A person who is at least seventeen (17) years old but less
19	than eighteen (18) years old may apply for and obtain a full operator's license if the person meets
20	all of the following requirements:
21	(i) (A) Has held a limited provisional license issued by the division of motor vehicles for
22	at least twelve (12) months;
23	(B) Has not been convicted of a motor vehicle moving violation or seat belt infraction
24	during the preceding six (6) months.
25	(ii) A person who meets the requirements of this section may obtain a full operator's
26	license by mail. The restrictions on Level 1 and Level 2 drivers concerning time of driving,
27	supervision and passenger limitations do not apply to a full operator's license.
28	(C) Notwithstanding any provision of the general or public laws to the contrary, no
29	person shall be eligible for a Rhode Island driver's license, unless such person shall have
30	completed a minimum of six (6) hours of over-the-road driver's training from a licensed driver's
31	training school in this state. This provision shall not apply to persons who seek to obtain a Rhode

Island driver's license and who have a current driver's license from another state.
