**SENATE RESOLUTION**

**CELEBRATING MARCH 25, 2015, AS THE 194TH ANNIVERSARY OF GREEK  
INDEPENDENCE DAY**

Introduced By: Senators Raptakis, Paiva Weed, Nesselbush, Gallo, and Jabour

Date Introduced: March 25, 2015

Referred To: Recommended for Immediate Consideration

1           WHEREAS, On March 25, 1821, the Feast Day of the Annunciation, the Greek nation  
2 reclaimed its ancient heritage as the "Cradle of Democracy" by overthrowing the yoke of  
3 oppression which had enslaved its people since the fall of Constantinople in 1453. Conquered by  
4 the Ottoman Turks in the 15th century, Greece waged a successful War of Independence (1821-  
5 1829) and re-instituted a democratic form of government; and

6           WHEREAS, The people of the United States generously offered humanitarian assistance  
7 to the Greek people during their struggle for independence; and

8           WHEREAS, The price for Greece in holding onto our common values in their region was  
9 high, as hundreds of thousands of civilians were killed in Greece during World War II; and

10           WHEREAS, Greece is only one of three nations in the world, beyond the former British  
11 Empire, that has been allied with the United States in every major international conflict in the last  
12 100 years; and

13           WHEREAS, The Government and people of Greece actively participate in peacekeeping  
14 and peace-building operations conducted by international organizations, including the United  
15 Nations, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, the European Union, and the Organization for  
16 Security and Co-operation in Europe, and have more recently provided critical support to the  
17 operation of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization in Libya; and

18           WHEREAS, Greece, located in a region where Christianity meets Islam and Judaism,  
19 maintains excellent relations with Muslim nations and Israel and demonstrates religious

1 tolerance; and

2 WHEREAS, Greece and the United States are at the forefront of the effort for freedom,  
3 democracy, peace, stability, and human rights; and

4 WHEREAS, Those and similar ideals have forged a close bond between Greece and the  
5 United States and their peoples; and

6 WHEREAS, In February of 2015, President Barack Obama expressed support for the  
7 new Greek government; and

8 WHEREAS, March 25, 2015, Greek Independence Day, marks the 194<sup>th</sup> anniversary of  
9 the beginning of the revolution that freed the Greek people from the Ottoman Empire and  
10 celebrates the aspirations for democracy and tolerance that the peoples of Greece and the United  
11 States share; and

12 WHEREAS, The Government of Greece has taken important steps in recent years to  
13 further cross-cultural understanding, rapprochement, and cooperation in various fields with  
14 Turkey, and has also improved its relations with other countries in the region, including Israel,  
15 thus enhancing the stability of the wider region; and

16 WHEREAS, It is proper and desirable for the United States to celebrate this anniversary  
17 with the Greek people and to reaffirm the democratic principles from which these two great  
18 nations were born; now, therefore be it

19 RESOLVED, That this Senate of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations  
20 hereby celebrates March 25, 2015, as the 194<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Greek Independence, reaffirms  
21 Rhode Island's abiding commitment to the magnificent principles of democracy and religious  
22 freedom, and urges Turkey to respect the rights and religious freedoms of the Ecumenical  
23 Patriarchate; and be it further

24 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and hereby is authorized and directed to  
25 transmit duly certified copies of this resolution to the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church of  
26 Cranston, the Assumption Greek Orthodox Church of Pawtucket, the St. Spyridon Greek  
27 Orthodox Church of Newport, the members of the Rhode Island Congressional Delegation, and  
28 Archbishop Demetrios of the Greek Archdiocese of America.
